Since June 11th 1943 with the occupation of the Isle of Pantelleria my son-in-law was made prisoner of the American Command and ever since then my daughter has been ill and getting worse day by day. The only

cause; as the doctor's say of this illness is the absence of her husband. To feel this evil we depend on your kind heart as mother. Through the newspapers we have read of your noble and generous souls, so I am sure this letter will not be thrown away without a kindly answer, by releasing my son-in-law from his prison and make my daughter happy.

Thanking you ever so much and excuse me for disturbing you. Wishing that this war will end soon with America's Victory and the liberation of Italy.
