MEMORANDUM

Lima, November 12, 1946.

TO: Andrew Corry  
FROM: Enrique Summers *ESummers*  
SUBJECT: Roosevelt Agricultural School of Concepción.

The Roosevelt School was established in 1932.

At the beginning this institution was named Agricultural School # 505 of the Concepción Valley. Later, in the year 1945, it was named Franklin Delano Roosevelt in order to honor the name of this great Statesman, and to perpetuate in that area the idea of interamerican cooperation initiated by him.

The major object of this school is the teaching of modern agricultural practices to the children and young generation of Concepcion Valley.

This teaching deals with the procedure and method of cultivating the most important crops of the area as well as the system needed to commercialized the products obtained, that is, if they could be industrialized in the area.

They not only have well trained teachers for this program but also available land where the students obtain practice in doing what they have been taught.

Recently the "Servicio Cooperativo Inter-Americano de Educación" started working with the Agricultural Schools, including the Roosevelt School of the Concepción Valley. Competent personnel was appointed for the teaching already started in the later school, and assistance was requested from SCIPA for machinery,

tools and for technical advice of the Rural Agent in Huancayo. SCIPA's has helped as requested and the Roosevelt School has equipment on hand to secure practice in the subjects taught in the classroom.

This school is of considerable importance, as it provides the youth with agricultural training in an important agricultural area; and the parents naturally also obtain many positive benefits from the above program.
