Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:

I have had the matter looked into concerning Mr. Frederick A. Williams, who desires to transfer from the post office at Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, to some point in Arizona or California.

Mr. Williams was appointed as a war service indefinite substitute clerk on February 1, 1946. He received a probational indefinite substitute clerk appointment on July 9, 1946. The Civil Service Commission, with whom we took up the question of his transfer, will not agree to the transfer of any employee until they have served a probationary period of at least one year. Mr. Williams, therefore, will not be eligible for a transfer until February 1947.

Mr. Williams has been fully informed on the subject and told that favorable consideration will be given to his application for transfer on February 1, 1947, if he still desires such action at that time.
