RESOLUTION

Adopted by  
1947 Delegate Conference  
April 11-13  
San Francisco

WHEREAS this day is the second anniversary of the death of Franklin Delano Roosevelt; and

WHEREAS during his long tenure in office, Mr. Roosevelt showed a keen sensitivity toward the needs and rights of people in this country and throughout the world; and

WHEREAS he had a sense of the basic importance of human relations in the administration of the affairs of state; and

WHEREAS he was responsible for initiating a variety of welfare programs which many of our members are now administering;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the 1947 Delegate Conference take official cognizance of this day and of the great and humanitarian leadership of Mr. Roosevelt; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the AASW hereby pledge itself to further the ideals so effectively set forth by our former President and to continue to work for the creation and expansion of programs which will permit people everywhere to maintain personal integrity and a sense of well-being and security; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this resolution be sent to Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt and to the press.
