
Dear Friend:

Ardis and I have just discovered that we failed to reply to your letter of July 31 (!) regarding the Gibbs family, about whom Mrs. Roosevelt had written to you. Reply was delayed hoping that good news could be passed along, and I am afraid that, after the good news became available, we forgot to report to you.

We called upon the Gibbs family at different times after receiving your correspondence and went with them to examine several possible places of residence. Late in the fall, they decided upon a small country place near Wharton, New Jersey, on Long Valley Road, and are now comfortably located there.
