
Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:

Reference is being made herewith to my letter of March 28th, 1945. Changed circumstances necessitate an amendment to above communication.

The pertaining Army office signed my alien clearance on April 5th, 1945, thus authorizing me to work as a Physicist with Control Instrument Company in Brooklyn, N.Y.. On April 7th, said company informed me that my engagement had been cancelled because one had not counted anymore with receipt of the permit. As a consequence, I am now even unemployed and trying to become usefully located as a Physicist somewhere else.
