Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:

As I suppose Mr. George T. Bye has told you I am finishing just now a book on certain war time experiences in which much mention is made of my contacts and conversations with the President.

I should be very glad to send you the parts of the manuscript relating to my meetings with the President, prior to handing them over to the publisher. I would do this mainly because I want them to be a rigorously accurate tribute to the souvenirs of a man whom I continue to admire for his noble and idealistic endeavors.
