Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:-

It is with considerable diffidence that I enclose to you a copy of the June issue of The Icelandic Canadian in which I have attempted to express, in merest outline, my interpretation of the life and work of your late husband.

About four years ago I lost my wife, and my abiding consolation is the feeling that I am endeavoring to do what I know she would have wished me to do and that in my very work she may be providing inspiration and guidance.

I apologize for my intrusion, but I did think you would not mind if a humble Canadian were to put in words his appreciation of the husband you have lost, the President your country has lost and the world leader to whom the World Security Organization is so fitting a monument.
