of lumber. I was not able to to work but they
pushed me on the job something easy to do. Then they
put me on a rib saw and a piece of lumber flew and
injured my eye, so there was no compensation on this
injury either, this happened in Feb. 1947. When I came
back on the job from this injury they put me on the
bailing hand machine it was a heavy job, and I was
not able to do it because of my injuries. So I was with-
out work again.

When finally they put me on an easier job till
was laid off my job in May 1947.

After this job I worked some place else
and was not able to work on account of my
injury. Now I was forced to draw my old age
pension which does not cover my expenses. My
birthdate is June 10, 1883. Please look into
this matter for me for which I could have more
satisfaction I thank you.
