Than we have by His grace and His will.


Our President was a wonderful leader, With a wonderful mind to do good. And, with his body impaired by an ailment, He finished his work as he should.

His work here on earth is completed The way God had meant it to be; And now He has taken him Heavenward, His spirit to ever be free.


I am sure this Tribute will be paid him Up there with the Angels above; "Well done, thou faithful servant-Enter into the joys of His love".








FRANKLIN D. ROOSEVELT MEMORIAL PLANETARIUM SERT-LOUIS STEVENSON MAY, 1947

THEIR NAMES (alphabetical)

ARIES THE PAM Aries does not look like a ram but it is the first constellation of the zediac. Therefore encient piople gave it that name because the ram played an important part in their legends and religious.

AURICA THE CHARIOTHER Aurica is represented by a shepherd carrying a goaton his shoulder and holding two kids with his left hand. The name "charioteer" may have been assigned to the constellation because of its resemblance to a bear which early pecules called "charlot". It includes Capella, the "Shepherd's Star".

BIG DIPPER Porhaps the best known constellation in the sky is the Big Dipper. It is also known as the Big Bear. "Bear" in Greek is "Arctos". Because the Big Dipper is in the northern sky we get the nave "Arctic Circle" and, in the South, the Antarctic Corcle.

CANCER THE CRAB Everybody knows that the days get longer in summer and shorter in winter. As they get longer the sun rises more and more to the north. On the longest day of the year, June 21, it stops rising more and more to the north but instead, it starts poing back to the south. Well, on June 21, the sun is in the constellation Cancer so that constellation was given the name Cancer the Crab because the crab can go in both directions, walking backwards and forward equally well.
