Dear Mrs. Roosevelt,


Accompanying this letter you will receive a first copy of the book, "Wartime Correspondence between President Roosevelt and Pope Pius XII," which will be offered to the public on the anniversary of the decease of the late President.

President Truman has already made the manuscript available to you. Its preparation has been approved by him and other governmental officials and by His Holiness Pope Pius XII. It is offered by me as a tribute to my friend, Franklin Roosevelt.

My intention is to send you very soon a few additional copies of the deluxe edition of the book, so that, should you feel so disposed, you may present them to members of your family or intimate friends of yourself and the late President.

You will be pleased to hear that I have finished the portrait of President Roosevelt. It has gone splendidly, and I am pleased, as I wanted the best for the White House.

This terrible black-out-winter has had one advantage, as I had to put off so many sitters it gave me the chance to concentrate on one portrait.

We sail the day after tomorrow on the "Queen Elizabeth" for New York, arriving on April 7th. I am taking with me both the portraits of President Truman and President Roosevelt so that will save a long delay and trouble. We shall be staying at the St. Regis Hotel. A day or so after arriving we may go to Tarrytown as Mr. Rockefeller wants me to get in touch with him on my arrival.

My dear Mrs Roosevelt *Book copy*

The enclosed book "Martin's
Correspondence between President
Roosevelt and His Holiness Pope
Pius XII. is delivered to you in
advance of the April 12, Anniver-
sary of his decease.

It is my testimony to him as
President and friend.

Officially the book will be put
on the market on his Anniversary.
It seems fitting however that I
should anticipate its publication
by making it a personal Easter
offering to you.

The publishers Messrs. The Nickles
& Co. will deliver to you an inscribed
copy. It is my desire to send to
Each of your children, a copy of

the book, if you wish to good
enough to give me the correct
names and addresses of each.

The "Presentation" Edition, like this
one, is limited to 200 copies -
none will be sold - The DeLuxe
Edition, of which I have enclosed a
copy is limited to 1000, and will
be sold at \$10. A Public Edition
10,000 will be sold by The Millen Co
at \$2.50 each.

President Truman has already given
you the manuscript for your inspection.
The text was approved by His Holiness,
The President and officials of the
Department of State. The President
donated to American Red Cross
that all returns from the book
be to it and not to me. The
copy might thus be taken in
the name of American Red Cross.
and the tribute to Franklin was
made by it.

I earnestly hope you will find the
letters, mostly ~~not~~ presented, of the
