Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:

I have just returned from Europe to find your very generous letter of December 16 on my desk. I wanted to write you from Europe but living conditions were so uncomfortable there that I could accomplish no more than brief notes to my family.

The success of the International Refugee Organization at the General Assembly was due entirely to the sincerity and conviction which lay behind your skillful presentation. I may have helped to make the balls, but you threw them with such dramatic effectiveness that in my mind the final result was never in question.

Since my return I have heard of the particular effectiveness of your final speech, and I take real pleasure in having participated in drafting it in outline and in substance, but you gave it life.
