Dear Mrs. Roosevelt:

By this morning's newspapers I notice with a great deal of pleasure that you will accompany the President for the opening of the World Security Conference, April 25th.

My presumption is that, quite likely, the Presidential Party will remain on the special train for the duration of the visit, however, if hotel accommodations are required you know, of course, I shall be delighted to offer you the facilities of the St. Francis.

I have in mind particularly my own apartment, which consists of a large parlor, three bedrooms, a dining room and three bathrooms. I do not believe you saw the entire apartment the evening you so graciously visited us, but I believe it would serve the President's needs very well. Mrs. London and my two daughters expect to be in the country for the first two or three weeks of the Conference so it would not disturb us in the least.

Also, if you remember, the entrance to our apartment is almost immediately adjacent to the Post Street elevator which can be reserved for the private use of the President. This elevator stops at Post Street, which is the entrance around the corner from the main hotel entrance, and which is on street level with no steps.

It has been two or three months since I have seen Jimmy, but I have had several messages from him brought to me by some of his brother marines.

Mrs. London joins me in extending to you our most cordial regards.
