Dear Miss Thompson:

Mrs. George Carlin telephoned me that she was arranging to meet Mrs. Roosevelt and accompany her to the Cathedral House, and later to her home, which is but one block from Cathedral House.

I have been requested by Mrs. Sabra Holbrook, the Moderator of our Youth Session, to tell Mrs. Roosevelt, that since the participants in the Youth Panel are young people, between the ages of thirteen and sixteen years, that Mrs. Holbrook will attempt, through the kind of questions she will ask, to move the discussion from the consideration of the reeducation of the German and Japanese people, to the consideration of American education, such as these children are receiving, and ways in which they can take advantage of it, perhaps remodeling it at points, in order to prepare themselves for world citizenship and the maintenance of world friendship. The children have democratically selected the topic, "What Can We Do To Educate The People of Germany and Japan For World Peace?" They will build their own discussion outline.

We are greatly honored that Mrs. Roosevelt will be with us on April 18th at 2 P.M., and look forward, with keen interest, to her address.
