It will be a great pleasure to have you join us for luncheon on Tuesday, November the twenty-sixth, to honor Jan Masaryk, Minister of Foreign Affairs of Czechoslovakia, and his country's principal delegate to the General Assembly of the United Nations. Your presence will be a tribute to a man whose long and intimate participation in the struggle against fascism has earned him the deep respect of peoples the world over, and especially of his own countrymen, who never ceased resistance against the Nazi occupation. Mr. Masaryk will speak on "Today's Struggle for Peace in Central Europe."

Not only in the official Assembly does Mr. Masaryk contribute his understanding and experience to secure international cooperation, in recognition of his outstanding abilities, the representatives of thirty-three countries, meeting recently in Luxembourg, elected Mr. Masaryk as President of the World Federation of United Nations Associations, the international organization dedicated to the task of realizing and developing the purposes of the United Nations. It will be a fitting tribute to Mr. Masaryk to use this occasion to make possible a great extension of the work of the World Federation through financial support of its program.

This is of particular significance to all of us who actively support the vital and effective program of the American Association for the United Nations, which is an integral and leading member of the World Federation. Contributing their valuable help in forwarding this work are Henry A. Atkinson, Dana Converse Beckus, Mrs. Harvey K. Davis, Malcolm W. Davis and Mrs. William Dick Sporborg, who will be with us at this meeting.

We will be very happy to have you join us in greeting and honoring Mr. Masaryk. We are meeting at twelve-thirty o'clock on Tuesday, November 26th, at the Hotel Commodore. Reservations are \$3.50 per person; tables of ten are available at \$35. Will you be kind enough to reply at this address or, if you prefer, telephone reservations may be made to Mrs. Eve Bates at Bitterfield 8-8000.
