My dear Mr Roosevelt

21st February, 1946. Juli regret that I was It was to my very great regret that I was unable to pay my compliments to you during your trip to Germany, but I should like you to know how extremely grateful to you I am, for your very great kindness in so far putting yourself out as to do as I asked you in London and visit some of my Displaced Persons camps in the United States Zone of Occupation.

I do hope that what my people were able to show you will be of help to you in the tremendous work you are doing for these poor wretches that UNRRA has in its care. And I should like you to know how very greatly your visit inspired all of the UNRRA people who are giving such magnificent service in the very often awkward circumstances that prevail in Germany today.

I do trust that if there is any way in which I can be of service to you you will not hesitate to let me know. It was so kind of you to spare the time to see me in London. We are all of us pursuing one common aim and it was a great privilege to be able to compare notes with one like yourself who is playing such an immense part in this great humanitarian campaign.
