Highly Esteemed Sir Morgenthau:-

First of all I, a total stranger, must apologize for inconveniencing you with this letter.

I turn to you, since I know that you also are a Jew and therefore my most humble request will be fully understood. We Jews in Germany are compelled to seek for ourselves another home, and since I know that America receives them in such a whole-hearted manner, I should like to ask if you, highly honored sir Morgenthau, might, with your wife, help a fellow-believer to know how to immigrate thither. Since I do not have any relatives over there, it is impossible for me to procure the affidavit and I ask you, in open hearted manner, to grant me the same. Be convinced that God, the Almighty, will repay you and bless you.

Do a good work and help us so that we may come to America. Let me not appeal in vain to your whole heartedness and generosity.

In the hope of soon hearing a favorable reply, I remain with a passionate benediction for you.

Dear Sir,

You will be surprised to receive from me till now a stranger to you, some lines and to beg you to listen to me for a few minutes.

As the daughter of the dead merchant Josef Gundelfinger of Heillpoun and Veikar in Württemberg I am distantly related to your parents. Learned of this relation, and permit myself to make the inquiry to you, Mr. Morgenthau, whether you would be able to help me in getting an affidavit for a stay in U. S. A. for my husband and myself. My husband is 54 years old, has been 25 years in the municipal authorities and indeed in the hospitals, in property when attendance and care of patients. I think, that you in your capacity of financier and in concerning of the great authority of which you rejoice that you will have influential references and I give you many thanks in advance for your favor.

On taking notice of the many Germans in U. S. A. this business is certainly much requested (I have heard thereof from different people).

I should be very much obliged to you in proving this matter and I beg you to give me as soon as possible your reply.
