The Netherlands Ambassador
asked to see me last week.
Among other things mentioned
was the Committee of "Governments
in Exile" (he prefers Refugee
Governments) - regarding which
he strongly stated that Paul
Van Zeland - whom I believe both
you and I like, did not repre-
sent either his own Government,
Belgium, nor to any extent the
Netherlands Government. He went
so far as to say that Van Z -
was discredited in Belgium.

He communicated a message
to me from the Netherlands
Prime Minister which I
sent to you in confidence
on Wednesday.

With best congratulations
on your Toronto speech -
and regards please me.
