MEMORANDUM FOR THE PRESIDENT:

A radiogram received from General Stilwell under date of April 30th is paraphrased as follows:

"Japanese in Lashio and threaten Bhamo. Tomorrow I intend to fly over from Schwebo in order to try and bolster the front at Lashio. The jig is about up. Should I finish up in India or in China, if there is a choice? A prompt answer is requested."

In response to the above message, the following message was sent with the approval of the Secretary of War:


"It is assumed that retirement to India would be tied into your plan to train 100,000 Chinese in India. If Wavell sees eye to eye with you, that would be preferable plan from the War Department point of view. However, this plan for the use of Chinese troops must have the approval of the Generalissimo. Signed Marshall."

INDIA, CHINA, BURMA

LAND:

1. We are still without news from General Stilwell. Colonel McClure from London states that the War Office have not heard from General Alexander.

However, press reports and communiques indicate that the Japanese attack in the South Shan States Front toward Taunggi continues. The threat to Lashio is obvious. The Japanese are now understood to be about 10 miles East of that Point.

- A Chinese communique states that their forces are now engaged nearly 50 miles North of Pyinmana. The Jap spearhead along this sector of the front follows the line of the valley and railway.
 No report from British sector.
- AIR: 1. The RAF and AVG are still grounded.
 - General Brereton from New Delhi states that he has now organized the Ferry Command Service. It is divided into two sections: The Indian Ferry Command and the Assam-Burma-China Ferry Command (ABC). He wants immediately, 25 transport planes for the Indian leg and 25 for the ABC leg; plus additional planes for the Command service.

His plan, however, calls for 75 for the ABC leg, 25 for the Indian leg, and 25 for the CNAC; plus what can be supplied for the service command.

3. The position now is that General Brereton has at his disposition 11 planes for the ABC leg of which 3 are CNAC: 25 are on the way and 25 are ready for shipment.

The route (which covers a distance of about 2300 miles) runs from Karachi to New Delhi, Allahabab, Texpur, Saidya, Miytkyina and Kinming.

It is expected that Miytkyina all-weather runway will be completed by the 15th of May. Planes now use temporary dirt runway, Inasmuch as the rainy season has commenced operations have already been curtailed.

The only airfield available around Saidya is now being used not only by ABC Command but also by the RAF, CNAC, Indian Nat'l Airways and the British Transport Service. Congestion is heavy. However, another airfield in this area, which they hope to have ready by June 1st, is now being built.

Colonel Osmun, New Delhi, reports that aerial recommaissance in Bay of Bengal is restricted and spasmodic due to lack of equipment, and is confined to coastal waters.

INDIA, CHINA, BURMA

LAND:

- 1. There is no further news from General Stilwell regarding his projected counteroffensive. It seems improbable that he will proceed with his plan in view of the serious Jap threat to his left flant in the Southern Shan States.
- 2. We are obliged, this morning, to rely on British and Chinese official communiques which indicate that the Chinese, although they have abandoned Pyinmana, are fighting a rear guard action to the North of that point.
- 3. The British have withdrawn their forces on their left in order to cover the Chinese right flant.
- 4. It would not appear as yet that the Japanese tactics, simmed at dividing the British forces on the Irrawaddy from the Chinese forces on the Sittang, have been successful.
- 5. There seems little doubt that the situation, as Col. Betts pointed out yesterday morning, is extremely grave.

AIR:

- 1. We have no advices regarding either AVG or RAF activity. However, the Japs have been continuing their bombing and staffing of the British and Chinese forward positions.
- 2. Dispatch from Col. Osmun, states that the Japs for third time have sent reconnaissance planes over Chittagong. Reconnaissance flight consisted of no fewer than 21 planes. In the light of past experience principally in Australia, these Jap reconnaissance flights particularly when carried out in force, are invariably a prelude to serial bombardment.
- 3. In the same dispatch Col. Osmun states that heavy bombs dropped on Burmese towns in recent weeks have been principally of the 110 1b. type and that 1/3 were "duds".
- 4. ONI reports the sinking in the region of the Lacadive Is. of the SS WASHINGTONIAN enroute to Bombay.

CHINA:

Further reports have come in stating that Japs are continuing their attacks on airfields in the Eastern part of the Sountry.





Persons familiar with the situation fear that a Japanese attack on CALCUTTA, even a limited one, would result in serious interference with railroad operations in that region because of desertions of railway workers. A complete stoppage of traffic in the Bengal area is possible. The same considerations amply to the munitions injustry in that area. It will be difficult if not impossible to find replacements for skilled labor. The transfer of rolling stock elsewhere has led to a reported shortage here. This is important with reference to military communications, the handicaps of a burdensome refugee exodus, a mounting demand for motor vehicles, and the possibility of decreasing or halting road building between BURMA and ASSAM. Further developments will be reported. This is for Colonel Kroner, of Military Intelligence.



First part of message could not be deciphered. The following is the situation in BURMA today:

- 1. The British apparently have lost the spirit of the offensive. their primary consideration being the destruction of the oil fields at YENANG CHANG¹ and withdrawing. The only stiffening influence here is the Stilwell group, which has inspired British forces to be more aggressive and to cease destroying oil fields. It is believed that it is absolutely essential to unify command under American leadership.
- The comitting of additional amenese troops indicates that a major engagement with Chinese forces is developing today in the TOUNGOO area.
- 3. All airdromes in BURMA are being progressively destroyed by the spenese. The objective of the enemy force in the ANDAMANS may be AKYAB, which has already been bombed. The apanese bombed HEHO field, putting it out of use until "arch 28th. The Royal Air Force is without effect. The record of the American Volunteer Group has not been exaggerated but they have only ten planes and these cannot effectually meet 200 of the enemy. Planes in the airdrome at MAGWE were almost entirely destroyed because of absence of communication facilities for the air warning system.
- 4. The United Nations may not succeed here because of general absence of signal facilities. Coordinated action between the British and the Chinese is not possible due to absence of RAF communication.
- 5. With the exception of a small amount being brought in by air, all supply communications were severed by the capture of RANGOON. Heavy rains are falling on the MANIFUR road. Construction of the KALEWAD road will not be finished before the 15th of May when the rainy season begins. It is believed that the road will then be impassable. Forces in BURMA are now using their reserve supplies. No relief can be foreseen.
