1. US approval noted. Assume all companies affected agree to recommencement international service both directions.
2. Outward censorship worked out with British and US censorship liaison officers and controles technique were French effected.
3. All inward mail not censored by Imperial, US, Canadian or French controles technique will be censored by Civil Censorship Section.
4. References in your cable to letter and post card mail " in their usual and ordinary form" regard secrecy owing to make-up and contents, and not as to weight (see para 6)
5. Following amendments necessary to details in para 1 of our MAT 851
 - (A). Add at end " and Central Africa". One.
 - (B). Mails for Tripoli to be sent via Cairo for censorship. One.
 - (C). Delete "Algiers" substitute "Tunis". Mails for Corsia also to go to Tunis a decouvert.

6. Propose apply internal rates to correspondence between Sicily, Sardinia and occupied Italy. These rates for present as normally, but question of increasing them, on main grounds of increasing revenue, will be discussed with Italian authorities. For foreign outward mails propose: letters 5 lire for 20 grams, 7 lire for 40 grams (maximum), postcards three lire. Do you concur as regard rates, and weight limit (latter can be increased later).

7. AMG stamps at present in use in Sicily. Such other areas as so far operating using Italian stamps. Uniformity considered highly desirable. Italian stamps were supplied from Rome, but cannot count on getting further supplies from there or use of printing dies. Alternative is to use AMG stamps generally, but expediency of "Allied Military Postage" caption seems questionable. Possibilities are

- (A). Continue use present AMG stamps in Sicily until any such time that fresh supply of Italian stamps or overprint AMG issue(see para D) becomes available,
- (B). Continue use Italian stamps in Italy and Sardinia so long as supplies available,
- (C). Use present AMG stamps generally if and when supplies of Italian stamps are exhausted,
- (D). Use overprint AMG issue as alternative to present issue (C). We recommend (A), (B) and (D) on understanding that both present and proposed AMG issues would be in use for a time.

8. AMG stamp supply position bound up with use of such stamps in Italy and Sardinia. In any case, 5 million 50 centesimi required forthwith for Sicily by fast sea transport or air. Subject your decision on para 7, send first consignment additional stocks as follows in millions to Naples for Italy and Sardinia. 15 centesimi, 5; 25

The President has directed that measures should be taken to prevent the publication and circulation of atrocity stories emanating from escaped prisoners until he has authorized the release. One reason for this decision was not to jeopardize the present and future missions of the exchange ship Gripsholm particularly the delivery of food and medical supplies carried on that exchange ship. It is desired that effective measures be taken to prevent the circulation or publication of such stories emanating from any source. COMINCH has requested that this information be passed to Naval Commanders in your areas.

The following instructions are issued regarding publicity and the anti U-boat warfare. The President of the United States and the Prime Minister of Great Britain have been concerned at the number of statements which have been made from time to time by public persons and in the press on both sides of the Atlantic about anti U-boat warfare and the methods and devices employed in it. The enemy by piecing together portions of these statements may glean more information than is desirable.

It has therefore been decided that a monthly statement approved by the President and the Prime Minister, shall be issued on the 10th of every month and that apart from specially authorized announcement or statements by the President or the Prime Minister or duly constructive censored accounts of particular national incidents and actions this months statement will be the only one to be made on behalf of the British and American Government.

All departments have been so instructed and the press have been requested to cooperate in keeping the technical discussions of U-boat warfare within the limits of the official announcements. AIG 1 is as follows.

Addressed all senior officers, ships, establishments, W/T stations and other naval authorities, and civil establishments which may be concerned. Home and abroad and flag Officer Commanding, Royal Indian Navy. Headquarters Department of National Defence (Naval Service) Ottawa. Naval Board Navy Office Melbourne. From Admiralty.

Following is text of telegram No. 3446 dated June 20/2145Z from British Chiefs of Staff to General Eisenhower.

BEGINS. BIGOT.

1. We have been somewhat worried by the considerable speculation in the Press in this country regarding our next move in the Mediterranean in particular referring to the possibility of HUSKY.
2. We consider that suddenly to damp down on speculation regarding HUSKY might be more of an aid to the enemy than if the speculation continues and that we should therefore aim to confuse the enemy by playing up articles on the many operations. Arrangements for this are in hand with Ministry of Information.
3. Much speculation in this country is intelligent anticipation, but a proportion results from Press and Radio reports from North Africa. We suggest therefore that information released from North Africa should be so balanced to avoid stressing any particular possibility regarding our next move.
4. The Press here gave great prominence to the recent closing of the Turkish-Syrian Frontier. Similar good red herrings would be most useful.

French recommend delisting but present no significant evidence supporting such a recommendation. While we do not at present have information on basis of which French would be likely to do more than exercise surveillance of Mas we do not recommend his deletion Tangiers List. 



Signed Eisenhower cite FHCIV Murphy. NAF 157. The following paragraphs have been established as a basis for the committees liaison work. A. Censorship of the aforesaid means of communication remains in the hands of the French Service Des Controles Techniques. B. Access of allied personnel to French Stations must be approved in advance by the joint committee but instructions to French personnel will only be issued by the Controles Techniques. C. Requests for supervision by Allied authorities shall be handled by control Liaison Organization under the joint committee which is likewise authorized to set up Liaison detachments in other areas composed of an officer representing the local allied authority and an officer of the controls techniques. D. The Allied Commanding Generals will have the right to control censorship operations in zones of military operation until such a time as in agreement with the joint committee the control is returned to the French services. 

I am authorizing this procedure since I understand it was the same as was followed in the case of the Casablanca Conference. Request you inform me at once of receipt of this telegram and inform me of any possible objection to suggested procedure.

My own statements here are emphasizing 2 points only: complete unanimity of purpose between the 2 governments, and my own complete satisfaction with the arrangement and with the individuals assigned to me to carry out important functions.

Military censorship of Allied correspondents' dispatches whether by radio or other means continues to be subject to military censorship under FM 30-26. To Joint Chiefs of Staff repeated to British Chiefs of Staff signed Eisenhower. Reference AGWAR number R 591.

No other specific provision can be made for the theatre commander to assume or gain control of the board. This is NAF 126. The provisions under which the board is established falls within the framework of the entire agreement of 22nd Nov. This joint committee is the initial step to implement article 20. The unfavourable press comment re news summary number 3 and number 3, and number 1292 from Davis is only another, if more striking evidence of the fundamental misunderstanding of political and military conditions in a far distant theatre of operations on the part of the lay public in America. To Marshall for Elmer Davis from Hazeltine (O.W.I.) signed CINC cite FHPWO. Apparently newspaper critics in America are viewing North Africa from simple ideological or if you prefer idealistic point of view with little if any understanding of the fact that we are engaged in what is, and must remain, primarily, a military operation. Our military purpose is to secure North Africa and the Southern Shores of the Mediterranean, in order ultimately to strike at Europe. We did not come to North Africa to promote a political or social revolution. If we had attempted on our arrival or subsequently to overturn the entire Vichy created governmental structure, here, we would not have had either the manpower nor the freedom of action to strike toward Tunis.

It is natural enough that civilians in America, with little knowledge of either the military or the political situation in North Africa, were disappointed after the landing of our forces in North Africa, to learn that we were dealing and attempting to obtain the cooperation of the French Civil and Military Authorities previously approved by Vichy.

Apparently Americans hoped and therefore expected that simultaneously with the arrival here of American troops, Democracy, as we know it in America, would immediately start to flourish on African soil. When nothing of the

sort happened it was perhaps inescapable that they should have concluded that we were either being tricked by Astute Fascist politicians or that as a military force we were to be suspected of being reactionary and of deliberately making a choice between liberal and totalitarian elements to the disadvantage of the former.

Such views, inevitable as they may seem in America, bear little relation to the facts as we found them upon our arrival here. In the first place, North Africa from the military viewpoint is only, as Churchill pointed out, "A springboard". Secondly, American opinion is apparently confusing French North Africa with France itself.

This is a colonial area, differing from many other parts of Africa. Here the European Colonists have, for the most part, settled down permanently without intention or desire to return to their homelands. They no longer have any real identification with, nor self interest in, France. Furthermore they represent only a small minority in relation to the Arab population. In terms of race, religion, social views and psychology, the people of French North Africa are wholly dissimilar to the French in France. The French defeat of 1940 was a severe shock to North Africa but it was followed by a sense of relief on the part of many who felt that they had escaped the war. To such people our arrival here was neither a blessing nor a inspiring challenge. Little as they liked German and Italian domination, they felt that they had avoided actual fighting. Such people are not the material with which to light a prairie fire to leap across the Mediterranean and ignite France.

Furthermore, the American press fails to remember that before we landed, Tunisia, Algeria, Morocco and French West Africa were separate political entities, each with its individual line of authority coming from Paris or from Vichy. It was necessary for it to create a central authority which had never existed before. Some progress has been made in this direction. Mistakes have been made and much remains to be done. But what no American critic seems to understand is, that there is

a great paucity of qualified men to fill the highly specialized posts in the civilian administration of Morocco and Algeria. America further fails to consider the importance of a continuing orderly civil administration to our military operations. Abrupt, sweeping or radical changes, bringing into office little known or unqualified administrators, could create serious difficulties for us. This is particularly true where the administration is connected with Arab affairs. This after 2 years of German pressure and propaganda, it is obvious that we would not find Frenchmen in positions of influence or power in this area, who would satisfy the democratic feelings of America. But what America fails to understand is that amongst Vichy appointed or Vichy approved officials here, there still exist some Frenchmen who are bitterly Anti-Axis. This not possible quickly and easily to determine beyond question which are the French officials who merely change their coats with the shift in the wind and which are those who can be counted upon to cooperate fully against the Germans. We have tried to work with the existing administrative machinery, judged not on the basis of prejudice or past political affiliations in France, but upon a practical basis of how each French Official proves himself in action over a reasonable * Admiral Darlan offered to discharge any official for whom we could offer a substitute acceptable to the Allies and to the American and British press, provided only that he be qualified and also acceptable to the local population. No useful suggestions were forthcoming. Any Gaullist was considered as impossible, being regarded as too extreme by the leaders of the French armed forces.

The present criticism on the part of the ^American press centers round Peyroutons appointment. This case provides a typical example of the limited alternatives which had been open to us. We could have retained Chatel with his heritage of weakness and political harlotry. Or we could have insisted upon a Gaullist candidate to which the French military leaders would have been completely opposed. Or we could accept the appointment of Peyrouton, a man of known administrative ability with experience in

dealing with such intricate North African problems as that of the Arabs.

Contrary to the reaction in America, Peyroutons appointment has caused no outcry here. It has been well received to all appearances. He is generally regarded as strongly anti German and his antagonism to Laval is well known. The State Department consented to Peyrouton coming here and knew of his intended appointment. The only active dissatisfaction may be presumed to be amongst the Gaullists and left wing groups which in North Africa however plentiful do not constitute an organized body capable of running a government. The American press also fails to comprehend the good accomplished by the dismissal of Chatel, which alone is considered as a first step toward a general house clearing. As to outgoing political censorship, there has been none imposed by this headquarters for more than 2 weeks. There are now only 2 restrictions; on operational military information and on reports which might give the completely erroneous impression that there are divergencies in American and British views in this theatre of war. There are no such divergencies. Censorship by the French of local newspapers remains rigid to prevent local disension.

The committee of the Combined Boards send the following message. It is not a directive from the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

OWI has provided propaganda stickers and labels to the extent possible in UG 3 and UG 4 for Lend Lease material shipped North Africa.

The scheduled tea shipment in UG 5 is put up in half pound propaganda packages. Each package bears statements in French and in Arabic that the tea is from the US. Each package also carries a picture of an American Flag. To Eisenhower, Freedom Algiers, Pan 83, for Murphy and NAEB, signed the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

Do you concur in having OWI ship a supply of bags, cartons, boxes, stickers, and labels, all bearing propaganda markings for use in North Africa? OWI is anxious to do this.

The suggestion has been made that sugar to the extent of 1,000 tons be packaged here in similar propaganda packages of 1 pound each, such packages bearing propaganda labels and stickers. Also some of the other materials listed in your 3189 might be treated likewise.

Advice as to your views concerning the economic and political effect of such propaganda is requested. Also your advice as to the extent which this should be carried on would be appreciated. It might be pointed out in this connection that some danger exists in selling goods at retail prices which are regarded by consumers as too high. In fact, this special propaganda packaging might for that reason have a definite harmful effect.





"The only ambition of the French Army, which is being reborn today, is to bring about the reconquest of France. Not only the reconquest of the territory occupied for two years and methodically emptied of its riches but also the reconquest of an ideal which has been slowly viciated and strangled by totalitarian propaganda too often served by Frenchmen with criminal pens and traitorous voices. The face of France would not be recognized by anyone if my country should definitely renounce that "Dear liberty" which the Marseilles proclaims in favor of doctrines imported in the baggage of the invader.

We have had further conversations with officials today regarding their desire to establish a local authority at the earliest possible moment for reasons of public security and in the interest of the common war effort. The general concensus of opinion favored the appointment of General Henri Giraud to assume both civil and military authority in French North and West Africa. There was a meeting at four PM this afternoon of the council created at the beginning of this month which is now composed of Giraud, Governor General Bolsson, General Bergeret, Governor General Yves Chatei and Resident General Nogues. They unanimously decided to appoint Giraud as High Commissioner in French Africa and Commander in Chief of all the Armed Forces, this decision takes effect immediately at our request they agreed to withhold publication until tomorrow morning but desire to make a communique to the press before midnight tonight which will be for release by the morning papers of December two seven, they also propose to broadcast this news at six AM local time on the date. NAP fifty two from Eisenhower Freedom Algiers for Marshall for Secretary Hull and Combined Chiefs of Staff from Murphy. This solution for the reasons described in my three one two four appears from here to be the only practicable one. I recommend that we be authorized to lend our practical support to General Giraud in this task.

This is not a Combined Chiefs of Staff directive but is a message from the Committee of Combined Boards.

1. Do you consider U. S. censorship should stop all private commercial telegrams between U. S. and North Africa? Apart from security aspects (which are of importance) it is clearly undesirable that private traders should pass enquiries and conclude paper contracts which they cannot at present execute.
2. Private trade cannot be restored until shipping becomes available, of which there is little hope for some time, and until thorough import control procedure based on approved requirements schedules is in force. For Eisenhower Freedom Algiers for Murphy FAN 48 from Combined Chiefs of Staff.
3. Meanwhile this cable traffic (A) Will create an illusion of early resumption of trade, (B) Will lead to disappointment and resentment, (C) May indirectly assist inflationary tendency which we view with grave concern.
4. British censorship is holding up all private commercial telegrams between UK and North Africa, but cannot continue indefinitely unless American censorship does likewise.





I have always welcomed the opportunity to participate in the Herald Tribune Forum, because I have always been interested in the public presentation of all kinds of national problems.

In time of peace every variety of problem and issue is an interesting subject for public discussion.

But in time of war the American people know that the one all-important job before them is fighting and working to win. Therefore, of necessity, while long-range social and economic problems are by no means forgotten, they are a little like books which for the moment we have laid aside in order that we might get out the old Atlas to learn the geography of the battle areas.

In time of war your Government cannot always give spot news to the people. Nearly everybody understands that — and the reason for it.

This means that those relatively few people who do have the facts from all over the world, not only every day but every hour of every day, are precluded from discussing these facts publicly, except in the most general of terms. If they did they would almost inevitably say things which would help the people who are trying to destroy us.

In reverse, those who are not in possession of all the news must almost inevitably speak from guesswork based on information of doubtful accuracy. They do not know the facts and, therefore, the value of their statements becomes greatly reduced. Nor must we, in the actual progress of the war, lend ears to the clamor of politics or to criticism from those who, as we know in our hearts, are actuated by political motives.

The fact that this type of criticism has done less harm in the United States than might be expected has been due to the good old horse sense of the American people. I know from a somewhat long experience — in wartime as well as peacetime — that the overwhelming majority of our people know how to discriminate in their reading and in their radio-listening between informed discussion and verbal thrusts in the dark.

I think you will realize that I have made a constant effort as Commander-in-Chief to keep politics out of the fighting of this war.

But I must confess that my foot slipped once. About ten days before Election Day one of our aircraft carriers was torpedoed in the Southwest Pacific. She did not sink at once, but it became clear that she could not make port. She was, therefore, destroyed by our own forces. We in Washington did not know whether the enemy was aware of her sinking -- for there were no Japanese ships near enough to see her go down. You will realize, of course, that the actual knowledge of the loss of enemy ships has a definite bearing on continuing naval operations for some time after the event. We, for instance, know that we have sunk a number of Japanese aircraft carriers and we know that we have bombed or torpedoed others. We would give a King's ransom to know whether the latter were sunk or were saved, repaired and put back into commission.

However, when we got news of the sinking of this particular ship, a great issue was being raised in the Congress and in the public vehicles of information as to the suppression of news from the fighting fronts. There was a division of opinion among responsible authorities.

Here came my mistake. I yielded to the clamor. I did so partly in realization of the certainty that if the news of the sinking were given out two or three weeks later it would be publicly charged that the news had been suppressed by me until after the Election.

Shortly thereafter protests came from the Admirals in command in the Southwest Pacific and at our great base in Hawaii on the ground that, in all probability, the Japanese Navy had no information of the sinking and that handing them the information on a silver platter -- although we were careful not to reveal the name of this carrier -- gave them a military advantage which they would otherwise not have had.

This confession of mine illustrates to the people of this country the fact that in time of war the conduct of that war, with the aim of victory, comes absolutely first. They know that not one of their inalienable rights is taken away through the failure to disclose to them, for a reasonable length of time, facts that Hitler and Mussolini and Tojo would give their eye teeth to learn. Facts therefore become paramount -- facts that cannot be told to the public at the time, as well as facts that can and should be told at all times.

The posters that tell you, "Loose Talk Costs Lives," do not exaggerate. Loose talk delays victory. Loose talk is the damp that gets into powder. We prefer to keep our powder dry.

We have a gigantic job to do -- all of us, together. Our battle lines today stretch from Kiska to Murmansk, from Tunisia to Guadalcanal. These lines will grow longer, as our forces advance.

We have had an uphill fight, and it will continue to be uphill, all the way. There can be no coasting to victory.

During the past two weeks we have had a great deal of good news and it would seem that the turning point of this war has at last been reached. But this is no time for exultation. There is no time now for anything but fighting and working to win.

A few days ago, as our Army advanced through North Africa, on the other side of the world our Navy was fighting what was one of the great battles of our history.

A very powerful Japanese force was moving at night toward our positions in the Solomon Islands. The spearhead of the force that we sent to intercept the enemy was under the command of Rear Admiral Daniel J. Callaghan. He was aboard the leading ship, the Cruiser San Francisco.

The San Francisco sailed right into the enemy fleet -- right through the whole enemy fleet -- her guns blazing. She engaged and hit three enemy vessels, sinking one of them. At point-blank range, she engaged an enemy battleship -- heavily her superior in size and fire-power. She silenced this battleship's big guns and so disabled her that she could be sunk by torpedoes from our destroyers and aircraft.

The San Francisco herself was hit many times. Admiral Callaghan, my close personal friend, and many of his gallant officers and men gave their lives in this battle. But the San Francisco was brought safely back to port by a Lieutenant Commander, and she will fight again for our country.

The Commander of the task force of which the San Francisco was a part has recommended that she be the first of our Navy's vessels to be decorated for outstanding service.

But there are no citations, no medals, which carry with them such high honor as that accorded to fighting men by the respect of their comrades-in-arms.

The Commanding General of the Marines on Guadalcanal, General Vandergrift, yesterday sent a message to the Commander of the Fleet, Admiral Halsey, saying, "We lift our battered helmets in admiration for those who fought magnificently against overwhelming odds and drove the enemy back to crushing defeat."

Let us thank God for such men as these. May our Nation continue to be worthy of them, throughout this war, and forever.

President Quezon has brought to the attention of the Secretary of War and me stories giving details of escapes of officers from the Philippines. From Marshall for MacArthur. I understand some of these stories were cleared by censors in Australia. Mr. Quezon feels such stories endanger the safety of his people who have helped in such escapes and make it more difficult for other Americans to escape from the Philippines. He hopes your censors can prevent publication of details of escapes. We will try to handle stories of this type originating elsewhere.

Absolutely no information has been released from my headquarters with reference to action taking place in the northeastern sector of this area except the official communiques replying your 49 9th. By no stretch of possible imagination do they contain anything of value to the enemy nor anything not fully known by him. The release of such information by this Headquarters is specifically provided for in the general directive approved by all the nations concerned. The forces engaged in the present action involve all my naval force which includes the major portion of the Australian Navy, a large part of my air force involving many Australian components, and my ground forces which are the actual objective of the hostile movement and which are almost exclusively Australian. This is an action in Australian waters involving Australian forces and the very fate of the Australian people and continent and it is manifestly absurd that some technicality of administrative process should attempt to force them to await the pleasure of the United States Navy Department for news of action. The Australians are the most immediate ones concerned and the publicity to their Parliament and people is given without delay by the Prime Minister himself. As I have stated before, it is impossible under the conditions that exist to have a unilateral control of publicity exercised over this country and these forces by an American Echelon thousands of miles away. The Australian Government does not and will not recognize such a situation in which their sovereign rights in this particular are controlled elsewhere. Such an attempt could only lead to friction and resentment which would be completely destructive to a combined military effort. There is nothing that I can do that I have not already done in this respect. If I do not issue communiques involving this area such control as I have of the situation will entirely disappear. will resume their own publicity and their views on censorship differ so materially from the standard desired that the information that will flow out will be infinitely more liberal than at present. My communiques and all information from this Headquarters are given only in the broadest generalities. They emanate personally from me and so far as secrecy is concerned cannot be objectionable. Nothing is released unless the occurrences are in the area and involve forces belonging to the area. Under these circumstances I feel that it is absolutely essential that communiques such as those put forth be issued as circumstances demand.

Publicity purporting to emanate from your headquarters gives important details of recent naval action in the South Pacific. The Commander-in-Chief of the Pacific Fleet considers that premature release of information concerning action of forces under his command imposes definite risks upon participating forces and jeopardizes successful continuation of fleet task force operations. Information concerning action by land, sea and air forces under the control of the Commander-in-Chief Pacific Fleet will be released through the Navy Department only. This is in line with authority conferred upon Supreme Commander in each strategic area. It does not affect information concerning forces assigned to your command which is subject to your control. Please bring this matter to attention of Australian authorities to secure their cooperation. Request acknowledgment.

Press Dispatch in Washington Paper under dateline Allied Headquarters Australia April 27th States that Japanese Naval concentration including ships, planes, supplies and men are concentrating in Marshall Islands apparently preparing for a new operation.

(From Marshall for MacArthur) Japanese must be well aware that scouting by submarines would be ineffective for obtaining the mass of information which would lead to above conclusion and they would be justified in believing that their codes had been broken. The disastrous results of such a belief are obvious.

This together with previous incidents indicates that censorship of news emanating from Australia including that from your Headquarters is in need of complete revision. You are directed to take the necessary action at once.

Press releases emanating from the U. S. Forces in Australia concerning our air attack on the Philippines give numbers and types of planes involved, landings made, and many similar details of value to the enemy which will assist him in adopting immediate counter measures. (For General MacArthur)

Orders are being issued by the Secretary of War today on the subject of release of military information. Extracts from these orders follow for your information and guidance: "Commanders are directed to acquaint all personnel with details of what constitutes information of value to the enemy. Such information includes factual data concerning our armed forces including organization, composition, strength, state of training, equipment or armament of any unit, the morale of our armed forces, identification and location of units, assignment of personnel, tactical doctrines, tactical employment, troop movements, weather reports, disposition of our forces, photographs or descriptions of damage to military objectives and matters of a similar nature. It also includes strategic information which would lead the enemy to an interpretation of our war plans or intelligence as well as data concerning logistical matters."

"Commanding Generals of the Army Ground Forces, Army Air Forces and Services of Supply will be responsible that information is not released by agencies under their control without prior approval by the War Department Bureau of Public Relations, except that commanders in the field, within the continental limits of the United States, may release information pertaining to their respective commands, in conformity with War Department policy enunciated herein."

"Outside the continental limits of the United States the commanding generals of theaters of operations and commanding generals of task forces and defense commands will formulate policies for the release of military information in the areas in which they command, conforming to the policies inunciated herein."
