Paragraph 2. Paragraph 1. Last line "Chief Civil Affairs Officers" Should read "Deputy Chief Civil Affairs Officers", otherwise no comment.

Paragraph 3. Paragraph 2A. We find region 5 should be amended to read Chief Legal Officer 1 British Colonel 1 Deputy Chief Legal Officer 1 American Lieutenant Colonel; in compensation Chief Judicial Officer will now be 1 British Major instead of 1 American Major.

Paragraph 4. With above amendments recapitulation senior legal personnel now reads: National Headquarters Chief Legal Officer 1 American Brigadier General; deputy CLO 1 British Colonel; Chief Counsel 1 American Colonel; assistants to Chief Counsel 1 American Lieutenant Colonel and 1 British Lieutenant Colonel; Chief Judicial Officer 1 British Colonel; assistants to CJO 1 American Lieutenant Colonel and 2 British Lieutenant Colonels; Officer in Charge of Civil Courts 1 American Colonel; his assistants 1 British Lieutenant Colonel. Paragraph 6P. Paragraph 2C. Regard this as matter for adjustment between 2 governments on basis of reciprocity. Would indicate however that now that selection senior staff in other divisions must already be in process Washington and London, alterations may have far reaching implications and involve serious delay.

Paragraph 7. Paragraph 2D. Experience of Sicily operations not yet available to indicate any specific alterations. We have always had regard to substantial force of Italian medical personnel.

Paragraph 8. Paragraph 3. Agree if intended for meat inspection. If for treatment sick animals suggest inclusion under agriculture.

Paragraph 9. Paragraph 4 U Covered in our response to 2 A paragraph.

Personnel and organization reference operational plan and recapitulation and assignment tables inclosed your letter 24 July reference NAF 296 (To Eisenhower for FHMGS and NAGAP cite CAD).

Paragraph 1. War Department customary policy against allotment of general officers to specific posts was explained to War Office which has now replied still favoring proposals for Brigadiers in key staff positions and region heads. British Joint Staff Mission now requesting views of British Chiefs of Staff regarding

- A. 2 Deputy Chiefs of Staff positions at National Headquarters to be Colonels instead of Generals and
- B. Deferring actual appointments of as many Brigadiers in staff positions at National Headquarters as can be conveniently postponed to conform to US policy of not allotting general officer grades on Tables of Allotment but only to assign general officers or promote to that grade in specific instances where full justification exists. Appointment of Brigadiers as Chief Civil Affairs Officers in British headed regions seems to present no problem even though US selects Colonels for similar positions in regions where Chief Divil Affairs Officer is American.

Paragraph 2. Division of National Headquarters and Regional Staff Sections Chiefs between US and UK appears generally satisfactory with following exceptions:

- A. Recapitulation tables, inclosed your letter of 24 July, provide Staff Section Chiefs in regions of the

same nationality as that assigned at National Headquarters; i.e., Chief Legal Officer at National Headquarters and in most regions is an American. To assist complete integration and procurement top specialists it seems desirable to alternate nationality of similar staff section chiefs among regions.

B. Section 24 lists British Chief Civil Affairs Officer with US Deputy. Assume this clerical error and determination nationality of Chief Civil Affairs Officer will await determination supreme commander in Italy.

C. JSM asking views of British regarding acceptance of American as Chief of Division of Transportation in the event War Department obtains an outstanding railroad executive of greater stature than British candidate.

D. Recommend personnel be increased 50 percent throughout public health section with equivalent reduction in personnel for welfare section.

Paragraph 3. Intend including few veterinarians in Public Health.

Paragraph 4. Recapitulation region 6 when received may answer point raised in Paragraph 2 Sub paragraph A.

Paragraph 5. Appreciate your views regarding foregoing Paragraphs prior to submitting personnel and organization plan to Combined Civil Affairs Committee for approval

Your attention is invited to the President's letter dated 3 June 1943, "concerning a plan for coordinating the economic activities of the US civilian agencies in liberated areas." (From Marshall to Eisenhower for his eyes only) Letter was given to Holmes by Haskell. It is clearly the intention of the President that the operation of civilian agencies in occupied areas, under military control, be initiated at the earliest moment consistent with the military situation. This is our reply to your MAT 4.

The attitude of the President is clearly reflected in CCS 190/6/D (charter establishing the Combined Civil Affairs Committee): "The administration of Civil Affairs should be delegated to the appropriate civilian departments and agencies just as soon as the military situation permits. This may be accomplished gradually, even though the area is still the subject of military control. The decision as to when and to what extent civilian departments and agencies will assist the military in the administration of Civil Affairs will be determined by the Combined Chiefs of Staff, upon recommendation of the military commander in the area. Generally, responsibility for the handling of Civil Affairs should be relinquished by the military as quickly as this can be accomplished without interference with the military purposes of the occupation."

The question you raise as to whether the privileges of Lend Lease will be extended to occupied enemy areas is answered in a confidential Presidential Directive dated 29 July, copy of which is being forwarded to you.

It is obviously the intention of the President that the economic civilian agencies of the Allied Governments should enter occupied areas

prior to the termination of military government if the military situation permits, and it is clearly his opinion that such an arrangement can be made to function efficiently. In order that the utmost use may be made of economic civilian agencies and that maximum reliance may be placed on their work without jeopardizing the military purposes of the occupation, the President has directed in his letter of 3 June that: "The obligations and responsibilities of the area director during the period of military government are primarily to the theater commander and in no case will the area director act contrary to the will of the theater commander."

The purpose of this message is to bring to your attention the views of the President for your guidance in recommending a program under which civilian agencies will be admitted to participation in economic aspects of rehabilitation of Sicily.

To assist civilian agencies in making their plans (from Marshall to Eisenhower TAM 2) request the following information be furnished for the island of Sicily only:

1. The approximate date you contemplate recommending to the CCS that civilian observers enter Sicily preparatory to their assuming such responsibilities for supply, rehabilitation et cetera as may be delegated to them by Allied military government;

2. Your estimate as to which agencies will be invited to send representatives such as Lend Lease, OFERO et cetera and their British counterparts;

3. The earliest approximate date you will recommend that civilian agencies should be authorized by you to send full working teams to Sicily.

In the event conditions are such that you do not desire to submit the above estimates at this time statement to that effect is desired.

Reference paragraphs 14 and 16-2 of our 5973 NAF 250 and our NAF 295 indicating need for some 930 additional officer personnel after allowing for those which will be moved forward from AMGOT Sicily after operation HUSKY, also giving appreciation and making recommendations Military Government. (To AGWAR for Combined Chiefs of Staff and to USFOR for British Chiefs of Staff signed Eisenhower cite NAGAP and FHMGS NAF 296) If proposal is approved following are provisional details of personnel requirement and are liable to modification.

Gross total is divided into following subdivisions as it is contemplated that Military Government will be organized for regions in order that the territory may be coped with as advance is made up the boot. There would be extension of AMGOT Sicily except number 6 and number 7 which would require a new overall organization. Region 1-Sicily 210. Region 2- Calàbria, Lucania, Puglie 195. Region 3-Campania 138. Region 4-Abruzzi, Lazio 200. Region 5-Umbria, Marches 135. Region 6-Sardinia 100. Region 7-Central Government 417. Total 1395. Figure 417, region 7 should ultimately be reduced by 42 officers referred to in paragraph 3 below.

195 officer personnel from AMGOT Sicily have been provisionally allocated to region 2 and 42 to AMGOT region 1 and 2 Headquarters who it is proposed will be responsible for planning for region 2 including operations Buttress and Goblet. Net total number of fresh personnel to be provided will therefore amount to :

Regional heads with several million persons under their control and principal divisional heads in central administration should have rank of Brigadier General which should facilitate choice of first class men and ensure adequate status. Further CCAO and DCAO should have the rank Major General. Also percentage of Colonels and Lieutenant Colonels is somewhat higher than in Sicily by reason of the higher responsibility in the central administration. For ranks of Lieutenant Colonels and upwards propose that over-all division should be equal. In order to meet difficulties

of finding suitable man power in sufficient numbers we propose that for lower ranks, ie, Majors downward, division should be on basis 66 percent American, 34 percent British as under:

Senior officers American 118, British 117.
Junior officers American 487, British 268.
Grand total American 620, British 370.

It is apparent to all concerned here that higher calibre staff than hitherto available will be required at head of both technical and administrative fields if a successful Military Government of so large an area is to be organized. It is suggested that Government Departments must be prepared to supply senior personnel and key men should be enlisted from industrial and commercial posts. It is felt that the experience such personnel would gain would be of high value either in the event of their transfer from AMGOT to other theatres, or of the establishment of a commission of control over an Italian authority.

Drafts should contain generous allowances of Warrant Officers, NCOS and stenographers. Propose further that overall division of enlisted men should be on percentage, 66 percent US and 34 percent UK.

The overall allotment of ranks and grades granted NATOUSA is inadequate to provide for this personnel and additional allotments will be necessary for all this personnel.

It has further been agreed that the Supreme Commander should during the period of occupation inform the 2 governments through the Combined Chiefs of Staff what American and British officials he desires and the purposes for which he wants to use these officials in the local administration and that no other civil officials should be sent to his area except those requested by the Supreme Commander.

The Combined Chiefs of Staff have approved (BIGOT-HUSKY) the following additions to the directive which was sent to you in FAN 131 dated 31st May, 1943. Paragraph 6 A is in addition to Paragraph 6 previously sent you. Paragraph 12 is one of the originally omitted paragraphs. For Eisenhower Fortune Algiers, FAN 135, from the Combined Chiefs of Staff. The additional paragraphs follow:

"Para 6 A. The first objective must be to get and keep a local government working smoothly so as to relieve the Commander in Chief of all trouble and anxiety as regards civil populations. The following may serve as guidance:

A distinction should be drawn between (A) such organizations as do not exist for the benefit and security of the people, E. G., the party organization itself and all purely Fascist accretions which have been grafted onto the local governments system, and (B) those organizations which are of direct benefit to the people and whose removal would adversely affect the efficiency of the administration. The former should be suppressed, while there is a prima facie case for maintaining the latter."

"Para 12. Consistent with military necessity, the position of the church and of all religious institutions shall be respected and all efforts made to preserve the local archives, historical and classical monuments and objects of art."

The following memorandum was handed by the Prime Minister to General Eisenhower. (BIGOT HUSKY for Marshall for his eyes only signed Eisenhower cite FHLIA):

"Whether the important posts in the municipal and local administration should be staffed by Allied Military Officers or the maximum use made of local Italians.

HMG while not attaching high importance to the point feel that it is perhaps unnecessary to lay down in advance that 'all prefects and all Mayors of important communities shall be removed and replaced by military officer of occupying forces' and suggest for consideration the formula attached. 'All prefects and all Mayors of important communities shall be removed. If Italians are appointed to replace them these will be selected from amongst suitable non fascist Italians not holding any official position or from amongst subordinate officials preferably non fascist or who if fascist at all had only been so in name because their livelihood depended on it and not from conviction. It shall be made clear to any Italians so selected and to all Governmental officials and employees that their retention is solely on the basis of satisfactory cooperation performance and behaviour. If reliable persons cannot be found amongst local inhabitants to fill any of the vacant posts these shall be filled by military officers of the occupying forces, but on every occasion the overriding consideration must be that appointments made do not prejudice requirement of the Force Commander that local civil administration shall be as efficient as possible.' It will be seen that this provides

for replacement only when suitable local inhabitants cannot be found with the overriding consideration that appointments made do not prejudice efficient local civil administration.

Whether a Deputy Chief of Staff should be appointed to General Eisenhower or a small political section set up with an American Chief and a British Assistant Chief.

HMG while preferring the latter alternative fully accept that in principle General Eisenhower's wishes about his own organization should be met.

Channel of communication between General Eisenhower and the United States and British Governments and the function of the Resident Minister.

It is clear that all official communications from General Eisenhower to the United States and British Governments and vice versa should pass through the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

But incidents may arise and be given publicity in the press on which it may be necessary to take rapid political decisions on the highest level. So far as HMG is concerned the present practice is entirely satisfactory and it is suggested that the directive should state simply that 'the position at AFHQ of the British Minister Resident remains unchanged.' It will be recalled that Mister MacMillan is the personal representative of the Prime Minister and reports direct to him."

The memorandum is transmitted in full as bearing on matters now under discussion between the 2 Governments.

Following message (BIGOT-HUSKY) is in 3 parts. For Eisenhower Fortune Algiers, FAN 131, from the Combined Chiefs of Staff. Part 1 begins.

"This directive has been agreed upon by the governments of the United States and Great Britain and is transmitted for your guidance in the organization and operation of military government in the territory involved in operation HUSKY. You will be guided in all matters of general policy, such as those of a political, fiscal or economic nature, solely by the directives you will receive from the Combined Chiefs of Staff. Consistent with military necessity, you will conform to the guides herein set forth.

Section 1.

Political Guides.

1. There shall be a military administration which will show every characteristic of an Allied undertaking. Both the American and British flags shall be displayed at Headquarters and Posts of the military government. The administration shall be identical throughout the area.

2. (Final agreement not reached. To be transmitted later.)

3. Other representatives of civilian agencies of either government shall not participate in the initial stages. Their later participation will be subject, as to time and extent, to decision by the Combined Chiefs of Staff.

4. The administration shall be benevolent with respect to the civilian population so far as consistent

with strict military requirements. The civilian population is tired of war, resentful of German overlordship, and demoralized by the Fascist Regime, and will therefore be responsive to a just and efficient administration. It should be made clear to the local population that military occupation is intended; (1) To Deliver the people from the Fascist Regime which led them into the war; and (2) To restore Italy as a free nation.

5. (Final agreement not reached. To be transmitted later.)

6. The Fascist party organization shall be immediately dissolved. The entire Fascist party leadership (The "Hierarchy") from the top down to the local secretaries shall be removed from any post of authority. The Fascist militia and all Fascist youth organizations shall be abolished. Fascist leaders and Pro-Nazi partisans shall be arrested. Fascist doctrine and propaganda in any form shall be prohibited. No political activity whatsoever shall be countenanced.

7. War criminals charged by the United Nations (Names will appear on list to be furnished to you) shall be imprisoned and held subject to further directive.

8. All laws which discriminate on the basis of race, color or creed shall be forthwith annulled. Freedom of religious worship shall be promulgated. To the extent that military interests are not prejudiced, freedom of speech and press shall be instituted.

9. Measures shall be taken for the prompt release of political prisoners. Upon their release, they shall be cautioned that political activity on their part, during the period of military government, will not be tolerated. The special tribunal for the defense of the state shall be abolished.

10. Neither local political personalities nor organized political groups, however sound in sentiment, shall have any part in determining the policies of the administration. It is essential to avoid any commitments to, or negotiations with, any local political elements. Italian political leaders in exile shall have no part in

the administration.

11. The exercise of the powers of the Crown shall be suspended during the period of military occupation.

12. (Final agreement not reached. To be transmitted later.)

13. A plan shall be prepared by you to prevent transfers of title of valuable real and personal property which are intended to defeat, evade or avoid the responsibilities, fines or punishments imposed or to be imposed on present owners or the national government.

14. Propaganda will be in accordance with directives of the Combined Chiefs of Staff."

Monetary and Fiscal Guides.

"1. During the initial period of operations, the United States Task Forces will use yellow seal dollars and regular United States coins. The British Military Forces will use British Military Authority Notes and British coins, as well as local currency in their possession. Yellow seal dollars and B. M. A. notes are available in NATOUSA and additional shipments can be procured when desired from the United States Treasury and the British Treasury. Records shall be kept of the amount of currencies used by the United States and British Forces.

2. The use of yellow seal dollars and B. M. A. notes for army payments to troops and for local procurement shall cease and Allied Military lire shall be used in their place as soon as available, unless the military government decides that the time is not propitious for such change. The United States Treasury will have this A. M. lira currency ready for shipment to any point desired within 4 days after zero hour. Records shall kept of the amount of A. M. lire issued.

3. A. M. lira currency is not intended to

replace local lira currency already in circulation, but is designed to supplement it.

4. The rate of exchange between the United States dollar and the B. M. A. note shall be \$4.00 to 1 pound and both currencies shall be made interchangeable at that rate. The United States Treasury will make the necessary arrangements with the British Treasury.

5. The United States yellow seal currency and the B. M. A. notes shall be withdrawn from circulation as soon as it can be satisfactorily accomplished. The date for this withdrawal shall be determined by the military government after the operation has begun.

6. The rate of exchange to be decreed on D-Day shall be 100 lire to the dollar and 400 lire to the pound sterling. A proclamation shall be issued requiring all persons to accept the United States yellow seal dollars and B. M. A. notes at the decreed rate. Transactions at any other rate shall be prohibited. Holders of local and A. M. lira notes or deposits are not entitled to obtain dollar or pound notes without special permission. They shall obtain dollars or pound notes or any other foreign currency or foreign exchange credits only in accordance with exchange regulations issued by the military government.

7. All foreign financial and foreign trade transactions and all exports and imports of currency shall be prohibited except as permitted under regulations to be issued by the military government.

8. Under the military government there shall be established within the area an A. M. financial agency. It may establish sub-agencies where deemed desirable.

In so far as its operations relate to the provision of currencies for the pay and other cash requirements of military formations of either army, it shall draw the necessary resources from the military government currency reserve and will record the debit against the army concerned in the currency of issue. It is authorized to accept deposits from finance officers and from military personnel of the Allied Armies. In so far as its operations relate to civil administration, it shall draw on the currency re-

serve and debit against the military government.

If found practicable, and desirable, the bank of Sicily under the direct control of the military governor will be designated as agent for the A. M. financial agency. The military governor and other Allied military authorities, when satisfied that the bank of Sicily is under adequate control, may use that bank for official business, and by making credits available to it by providing it with A. M. lira notes, place that bank in position to finance other banks and branches for the conduct of their business as approved by the military government. When other effective banking facilities are not available, the A. M. financial agency shall be empowered to make loans. These shall be restricted to lira loans except in very special circumstances.

The military government will control and direct all receipts and disbursements for civil administration purposes, whether by U. S. or British Civil Affairs Officers, and through the A. M. financial agency, will provide all funds of whatever currency and receive all revenues and cash receipts. Thus all Civil Affairs Officers will draw funds only from the A. M. financial agency.

The records of the A. M. financial agency shall indicate in all cases in what currency receipts were obtained or disbursements made.

9. Upon taking over an area the military authorities shall proceed immediately to:

- A. Close all banks and financial institutions and place them under military custody.
- B. Declare a general moratorium.
- C. Impound or block for future disposal the funds of enemy government agencies, including government banks.
- D. Seal all vaults and safety deposit boxes.
- E. Obtain an inventory of the assets

of the banks as quickly as practicable.

10. Holdings of gold, foreign currencies and foreign securities, all national funds and the funds of Fascist political organizations shall be taken into custody as quickly as possible, and shall be deposited with the A. M. financial agency or banks designated by the military government.

11. Banks should be encouraged to reopen for business under the military government if and when it deems such action desirable. No governmental or private bank or agency shall be authorized to issue bank notes or lira currency. Access to safety deposit boxes or vaults will be allowed only when a proper system of supervision has been instituted. Gold, foreign currencies and foreign securities, and valuable papers, shall be withheld from the owner against accredited receipt.

12. Before banks are reopened, it should be made possible for them to arrange loans from banks or agencies designated by the military government. The lending may require as collateral any or all of the assets of the borrowing bank or of the directors thereof, and may accept, as collateral, obligations of the national government or of its subdivisions.

13. Except where special permission is granted, local banks shall be permitted only lira accounts, but may accept, at the decreed rate of exchange, yellow seal dollars and B. M. A. notes which they shall turn in as directed in exchange for local or A. M. lire at the decreed rate of exchange.

14. The military government shall have authority to maintain the existing tax laws and to raise such contributions for the administration of the country as are consistent with international custom and usage. All national tax receipts shall be deposited in the A. M. financial agency or in banks designated by the military government.

15. All branches of the National Insurance Institute shall be placed under military control and its revenues made available to the military government.

16. The railways, postal, telegraph and telephone services, radio and all government monopolies shall be placed under military control and their revenues made available to the military government.

17. None of the tax or other revenues shall be used for the payment of principal or interest on national government obligations."

Economic Guides.

"1. Measures shall promptly be undertaken to enable the country's own services of production and supply to assure as far as possible the provisioning of the local population. You are authorized to furnish from all stocks available to you such supplies to the civilian population as military requirements may permit. These supplies, in so far as feasible, shall be introduced for sale through existing commercial channels under rigid military control. Direct relief shall be employed only where necessary.

2. You will have the responsibility for the procurement of materials deemed essential to reestablish the various utilities and maintain agricultural production. You will also have the responsibility for the procurement of such strategic materials as may be needed for export for the use of the United Nations. No provisions for such materials will be made except on requisitions from AFEQ.

3. Maximum prices and rationing of important staple commodities shall be quickly established. Black market practices and hoarding shall be severely punished.

4. If found necessary by the military authorities in order to avoid the sudden disruption of internal economy, provincial and inter-provincial associations of employers and employees may be temporarily continued, except that Fascist or otherwise objectionable officers thereof shall be removed, and except that objectionable features thereof shall be abolished. The Fascist

corporations and their councils shall be abolished. The military government should give careful attention to the matter of sound, fair and voluntary labor relations and shall, if necessary, fix hours and wages of labor.

In determining what exports shall be permitted, paramount consideration shall be granted to the needs of the military forces and the local population. Exports shall be permitted only to friendly countries."

Reference your 7972. Most anxious NOT to have any chaplain or any others appointed for this purpose at any rate at this stage. Relations with local church dignitaries are normal functions of local government officers and CCAO. If they cannot be dealt with on this plane they must be dealt with at much higher level. Appointment of special officers for this purpose NOT only creates undesirable additional channel but may also be liable to misinterpretation locally and elsewhere as indicating contact with higher ecclesiastical authorities on Mainland. Unless there is strong reason for having this officer request my recommendation be accepted.

(4) Arts and monuments, American Major, to be filled by Captain Mason Hammond. Birley agrees to British Captain under Hammond.

(5) Reference your 8077, April 30th, T/O for Civil Affairs grades and ratings approved. Our figures show 39 Majors and 53 Lieutenants against total of 38 and 51 respectively your 8077. Other officer figures check. What part, if any, of Warrant Officers and Enlisted personnel are we to furnish? Please advise.

BIGOT Joint Chiefs of Staff have now designated War Department as primary United States agency responsible for advance planning all civil affairs for areas to be occupied and to coordinate Washington end such matters during period when military government continues in such occupied areas (from Marshall to Eisenhower).

War Department for security and other reasons has determined upon policy including only high State and Treasury Department officials in present advance planning stage for HUSKY.

Assume you are following same procedure of excluding NAEB and local representatives Lend Lease, BEW, Office Foreign Relief and Rehabilitation, Office of War Information et cetera from all planning and administrative responsibility outside North Africa. However we are concerned by contents of recent cables to Committee of Combined Boards for example BOC 351 April 13 requesting BEW to rush air mail recent data on ports in Italy and Southern France.

Matters of this nature affecting future operations and other areas are not the responsibility of the North African Economic Board, and we hope that you will be able to assist us in discouraging these civilian agencies from such activities at this time. We understand that you are in full accord with decision here that military government for HUSKY as approved by the President will be staffed entirely by military personnel initially.
