Troops in Myitkyina area continue progress with large gains. First Battalion 90 Regt in Western sector between 88 and 89 Regt pushed forward 200 yards. In Southwest sector 42 Regt and 1st Battalion 41 advanced 500 yards and captured assigned objective. 90 Regt less anti tank company now closed in Myitkyina area. Morris force evacuation complete 29 July. Concentration of 72 Brigade almost complete in area West of Mogaung. Last elements now Mogaung moving west. Patrols 3rd West African Brigade occupied enemy positions 6 miles north of Taungni. In this area north and northwest of Taungni patrolling continues. In Ukhrul area nothing. 33 Brigade of 7th Division now in Kohima area. In Palel area

Japanese intentions Manipur: Retain forces west Chindwin, unless pressed, in Kabaw Valley with outposts roughly 14 miles west of valley. Carrying out this plan depends on Allied advance on Palel-Tamu road and if continues, Japanese forces to north probably forced to eastward withdrawal.

Within Hengyang are Japanese troops reported. Remnants of Sino Ten Army still resisting but expected to collapse soon. Japanese 120th Regt 116th Division driving along Hengyang Kweilin railway is flanking Sino 79th Army to North and Sino 62nd Army to south of railway. 62nd Army reported to have suffered heavy losses with total strength of less than one division remaining. One regiment of 40th Division driving south from Yung Feng is attacking Sino forces in rear. Yung Feng again reported in Japanese hands but fate of capture not stated. In southeast one regt of 13th Division has moved northeast from Leiyang, reported approaching Chaling with small group Japanese troops still remain 12 kilos south Leiyang. Further north Japanese forces driving southeast from Shang Li occupied Ping Siang (113 degrees 50 minutes east-27 degrees 37 minutes north) and Siang Tung (113, 42-27, 38) on 27 July.

These forces thought to be 27th Division elements, but some indication that 34th Division elements involved. One battalion on Japanese troops reported 22 kilos east of Ping Siang.

Huto road reported completed to south of Hengshan. 2-300 trucks reported to have driven from Siang Tan to Hengshan with ammo and supplies on 28 July. 30-40 tanketts and armored cars \* area. 20 tanks and 50 trucks arrived Hengyang 28 July.

No change in situation Canton area reported. Rated C-3 is report from Sino G-2 who states report received from Honan that group of 7,000 Infantry and Cavalry with 2-300 trucks moved south along Pinghan railway to Sing Yang between July 6 and 8. Code number this unit reported as KO 2966. Sino G-2 thinks this may be one independent mixed brigade from Shansi. No confirmation of this.

Weekly summary for week ending 26 July.

1. U.S. Air:

20 July-In communications sweep of Changsha Yochow area 11 B24's, 173 P40's and 15 P51's in 16 missions destroyed 2 boats of 100 feet and 4 junks. 102 other boats were damaged. Between 45 to 55 trucks destroyed 115 damaged. 70 Japanese were killed. Much damage done to Changsha.

21 July-56 P40's in 4 missions strafed troops communications and installations in the Changsha Hengyang area. 35 trucks destroyed and 155 damaged. 40 Japanese and 50 horses killed. 4 sampans destroyed and 60 damaged. 1 Japanese aircraft destroyed.

22 July-In 12 missions 25 B24's, 175 P40's and 16 P51's attacked troops and communications in Hengyang Tungting Lake sector. 45 trucks were destroyed and 120 damaged. 288 boats destroyed or damaged. Much damage done to Hengyang Airfield and Town. 4 P40's sank 12 junks of 75 to 100 feet off the northeast French Indo China Coast.

73 P40's in 5 missions destroyed 45 trucks and fired installations in Hengyang area. Enemy troops on Salween front bombed and strafed by 10 P40's.

24 July-20 B25's, 134 P40's and 14 P51's in 16 missions attacked communications and dumps in Hengyang Tungting Lake sector and Peiloehi airfield. At Peiloehi airfield 30 fighters and 1 bomber destroyed 7 fighters probably destroyed and 8 fighters damaged. 25 junks and sampans destroyed and 37 damaged. 1 tanker of 250 feet fired. 5 trucks destroyed and 10 damaged. 6 P40's sank 3 junks of 60 feet. One 80 foot and one 25 foot barge off northeast French Indo China coast. Near Banthi 22 railroad cars destroyed or damaged.

25 July-River communications and truck concentrations in Hengyang Tungting Lake sector were attacked by 24 B24's, 2 B25's and 95 P40's and 9 P51's in 10 missions. 10 trucks destroyed and 50 damaged. 100 Japanese and 375 horses and cattle were killed. 40 junks of 35 feet damaged. 6 Japanese aircraft destroyed and 80 damaged. Off South China Coast 2 B25's destroyed a 35 and 25 foot barge. On Salween 9 P40's and 2 P38's bombed and strafed Japanese positions. Railroad at Than Moi northeast French Indo China was attacked by 2 P40's. 2 railroad cars destroyed and many others damaged.

26 July-Changsha and Siangtan areas were attacked by 98 P40's. 175 Japanese and 100 horses killed. 4 sampans of 40 feet sunk. 2 trucks destroyed. In Tengahung, Lungling

2. Chinese Air:

27 reconnaissance missions 11 offensive missions for  
a total of 173 sorties flown by Chinese Air Force. Japanese  
troops and positions were strafed and bombed. There were no  
planes lost.

3. US Ground:

Nil for period.

4. Chinese Ground:

There was little change in Honan area. In Changsha  
Hengyang area Chinese forced to withdraw to Pingshan. Chinese  
in attacking Chaling forced Japanese to reinforce this area  
with troops from Leiyang which enabled the Chinese to capture  
Leiyang and town now claimed to be in Chinese possession.  
Chinese are still holding out in Hengyang. There's no change  
in situation northwest of Hengyang. Yungfeng and Siang Kiang  
remain in Japanese hands. In Canton area Chinese claim that  
Japanese east of North River have moved back to original  
positions. West of North River Japanese also moving back to  
former positions.

5. Line of Communications report:

On Ledo Road fixed bridges across the Namung area open to traffic. Ferries are in operation at Tawang, Mogaung and on Namsang crossings. Ledo Road open from Ledo to Tanli River. Construction of causeway and corduroy progressing from Tanai to Tingkagk. Road in good condition from Tingkagk to Warazup.

First 4 inch pipeline-all tankage on line now complete. Capacity is 44,250 barrels. Second 4 inch pipeline-24 miles pipeline now complete from Tanai River towards Shingbuiyang. Double 4 inch pipeline from Digboi to Tinsukia-14 miles now complete. 6 inch pipeline complete and in operation from Calcutta to Dhubru.

Warazup airfield now open to all traffic. The railroad between Myitkyina and Mogaung and bridge 5 1/2 miles northeast of Mogaung now being used by special jeep trains.

Now follows delayed report for Y Force for 26th July.

From four directions troops 2nd Reserve Division  
and 36th Division and 116th Division attacked Laifengshan  
southwest of Tengchung and captured all but two enemy posi-  
tions. They were supported by fighters and bombers who flew  
27 sorties.

Manner of supply of enemy in Shungshan area four  
miles southwest of Seiven River along Burma Road was by  
parachute drop.

The 307th Regiment launched attack in Shungshan area,  
no gains made.

In Mangshih attacks by Chinese troops were unsuccess-  
ful. The 227th Regiment which was surrounded by Japanese  
force 6 miles north of Mangshih on 25th July one company  
broke encirclement and took enemy position.

Our liaison on Canton front states that Japs still only 22 miles north northwest of Tsingyun (2342 north 11303 east). American observers state that Chinese 65th Army near Yingtok (2410 north-11327 east) Chinese 64th Army west of Yingtok, and 63rd Army north of Lungmoon (2345 north-11405 east). 14th Air Force liaison in Hunan reports battered Chinese garrison at Hengyang-expects heavier Japanese attacks. Regrouping of Japs north of Hengyang may foreshadow drive southwest towards Lingling (2610 north-11134 east) or south through Changning (2625 north-11219 east). Main Jap strength appears concentrated west of Siang River. Chinese 62nd and 79th Armies reported advancing to relief of Hengyang garrison from west and southwest while other forces continue advance on Siansiang (2744 north-11227 east). Chinese also state that a new army is to be organized which will be located at Hengyang and assume control of defense of Hankow-Canton railway. These reports not confirmed but thought possible. Lieutenant General Uchiyama reported in charge at Lohochai and code number of 12th Army given as Hito (0088) 4321.

Chinese state their agent located Formosa has reported that on June 24th a tank unit having strength of 5000 men commanded by Major General Yamashita was transferred from Japan to Formosa. On same date a special air unit having 200 fighter planes, commanded by Okumura (1159-2625) moved from Japan to the Bonin Islands.

Independent Mixed Brigade now held by a Matsuri Butai whose sub units, thought to be regiments, have code numbers 3062, 63 and 64. This unit came to China in April, first located at Pukow and moved to Yuchi area in July. Chinese think this unit is 61st Division.

Sino agents in Phillipines recently reported that during two years occupation 458 boats having total tonnage of over 54,000 tons have been constructed by 11 shipyards employing 6700 men. Maximum capacity of these yards is 15, 200 ton ships or 125, 25 ton ships per month.

Presence of 27th Division in Hunan fighting has been confirmed by POW and document. Chinese also claim that 37th Division has moved from Hunan into Wuhan area but this unit has still not been identified in combat zone. Thought likely it may be holding area between Sing Yang south to Hankow formerly held by 3rd and 13th Division. Elements of 40th, 116th, 3rd, 13th, 34th, 58th, 68th and 27th Divisions have been identified in combat area by POW and document according to Chinese. Areas formerly occupied by these units thought now occupied by 5th, 7th and 12th Independent Infantry Brigades and puppet troops. 17th Independent Mixed Brigade and 37th Division may also be assisting. reports indicate that Japanese may attempt delaying or holding positions north of Humine. Captured orders referred to in last fortnightly report now known to be dated early June and referred to earlier Japanese attempt to retake Imphal. targets and made 1 effective attack on Akyab. Beaufighters in addition to normal attacks on communications severed oil pipe line at Minhla. Mitchells (B 25) damaged 3 railway bridges and permanent way between Naba and Myitkyina.

15. Air transport operations. Transport aircraft under their TAF and 10th Air force supplied approximately 5424 short tons to Imphal, 2660 to Stilwell's forces including 3 Ind. Division and dropped supplies GS forces converging on Ukhrul. Total transport effort was 4939 sorties carrying 14502 short tons and 4506 personnel, 2411 casualties evacuated to base hospital.

16. Other activities. African based Venturas attacked enemy submarine on surface off Durban. Dinghies and oil slicks observed but no sign of survivors. India and Ceylon based GR aircraft carried out many anti submarine patrols and searches for survivors. Night PD (PR) of Sabang Sumatra was successfully carried out by 1 Liberator and a second Liberator flew a most successful day PR. Sortie over the west coast of Sumatra as far south as latitude 2 degrees north.

17. Enemy activity. Enemy made 7 appearances over the north Burma battle front. Myitkyina airfields was ineffectually bombed on 7 July causing only minor casualties. On 9 July 9 Mustangs (P 51) claim 4-1-1 against 8 fighters near Bhamo and 4 Kittyhawks (P 40) 1-2-3- against enemy (?) near Myitkyina airfield. 1 aircraft was lost in each combat. Enemy ground troops infiltrated to Palel airfield and destroyed 7 RAF air craft on the ground.

Eastern Air Command increased their effort during the week by making 3000 sorties. Transport aircraft flew 1370 sorties 440 by the RAF and 930 by USAAF. About 2400 men and approximately 3700 tons were lifted and in addition 1184 casualties were evacuated. Strategic Air Forces effort decreased owing to the switching over of medium RAF and heavy American bombers to transport duties and also owing to adverse weather conditions. An indication of our air superiority in Burma is the fact that our Spitfires have now taken over theatre of short range ground attack aircraft. The Japanese appear to have decreased the number of their light bombers and twin engined fighters. As regards the former this may be due only to weather conditions but the twin-engined fighters may perhaps be required elsewhere. Eight British and American aircraft were lost and the enemy figures were 10 destroyed 4 probably destroyed and 8 damaged.

SPECIAL POINTS

1. Thanks to the determination and endurance of our troops the terrors of the Monsoon have been largely overcome. The very real difficulties of flooded rivers and boggy tracks have not held up our advance. Thus we have disappointed the enemy who hoped at least to retain his positions in the Manipur hills secure from Allied attacks. Now after several weeks of rain our land forces are continuously defeating and driving back the enemy with heavy casualties. At the same time the

Furthermore, plans for approved operations in the Pacific show a strong requirement for units of this type and it became necessary to indicate the resources that might be made available to that area. Accordingly, the U. S. Chiefs made a decision for tentative allocation which in the absence of detailed plans for employment was based on their general knowledge of the relative requirements of the various areas. It is important that you submit your plan at the earliest possible date in order that it may be considered in connection with the detailed plans and requirements from other areas. SOS support for these units is a problem on which we have not a satisfactory solution. This matter was stressed with Stratemeyer in a message April 12, reference WARF 22226 which asked what support the theater could provide. We have received no information on this. Trust that your plans will show clearly what support can be given.

Situation. The main feature of the week's operations in Burma has been the relentless pursuit of the retiring enemy over very difficult terrain by our columns moving from the Kohima-Imphal road to Ukhnule. In north Burma Allied forces continue to eliminate isolated parties of Japanese in the Mogaung Valley. It is now learned that 17,700 Japanese have been killed in this area since the commencement of operations. This figure added to the number killed by the 14th Army makes a grand total of almost 40,000 killed on the Burma front.

Air. During the week Eastern Air Command flew an approximate total of 2,500 sorties with abortive sorties only about 16 percent of the total. Transport aircraft continue to

maintain an exceptionally high effort in spite of the weather. From the 29th of June to the 4th of July inclusive approximately 1,380 sorties have been flown. 550 by the RAF and 830 by the USAAF. Roughly 2,300 tons and some 815 men were carried and 855 sick and wounded were evacuated. Supply dropping to our troops in the forward area continues unabated despite very difficult conditions. Enemy bombers in Burma have done little apart from training in recent months and their meager operational use may have been partly due to the prospect of their being required in an intensive effort elsewhere. Enemy fighter activity has been negligible.

- Special Points.
- (1) Speed with which our columns have advanced across country in relentless pursuit of the enemy following his defeat on the Imphal-Kohima road.
  - (2) Re-iterate the important part played by Indian troops in this difficult campaign. Indian troops comprise the major proportion of our forces on the Burma front.
  - (3) Stress the high morale of our troops which is unaffected by the hardships imposed by the nature of the country and by the Monsoon.
  - (4) With reference to special point No. 4 in last week's Guidance note that there are no indications of a resumed Japanese offensive in the Imphal area. It is clear that the enemy is withdrawing south from Ukhrul but as yet there are no more than slight indications of his pulling out in the Bishenpur area while in the Palel

Please pass the following to Marshall and Arnold.

The firm commitment of the second combat cargo group is noted in WARX 60776. I greatly appreciate the cooperation and realistic efforts of the U.S. Chiefs of Staff in making available resources required for the accomplishment of my directive. I have repeatedly pointed out our great advantage when we employ air to facilitate supply and manoeuvre (?). Perhaps in no other theatre of war are logistical conditions so difficult. Operations this coming dry season will be strongly influenced - in fact the degree of success will be determined - by our ability to manoeuvre by air certain elements of our ground forces and then to supply them. Failure to do this would sacrifice our air supremacy and would involve us in time consuming jungle warfare conducted at the unacceptable tempo of the ox cart. I have given instructions to my staff and commanders that this year it is imperative that we start early and seize the initiative in order to liquidate the enemy at least in upper Burma. Plans are being carefully prepared along this line and as indicated in message to you cite 222 5 July (attached) it was unanimously agreed that we will definitely require the second combat cargo group which your WARX 60776 now firmly commits to this theatre in August and further that we foresee the necessity for an additional (third) combat cargo group and possibly the fourth. I am sure that you will agree to these commitments if firm plans for the accomplishment of our directive indicate that we will require the third and possibly the fourth groups. Definite outline plans for operations post Monsoon will be forwarded this month. You may rest assured

that requests for resources will be kept to the minimum consistent with effective employment in the attainment of objectives established in our latest directive (COSSEA 108). In connection with air requirements and employment Stratemeyer and Beebe have been of great assistance. In connection with the Air Commandos all are agreed that they should retain their organizational integrity and there can be no doubt about the feasibility of their employment in our planned operations. We can foresee at this time the definite commitment of 2 and possibly 3 such units. Throughout the exchange of telegrams pertaining to Air Commandos and combat cargo groups you will note that I have rigidly adhered to the principle that I must honestly justify the delivery of the 400 combat cargo planes and the 3 additional air commandos. Obviously I could have submitted plans earlier for the employment of these resources but I have insisted throughout that such plans must be based on realism and the full capability to carry them out. It would now appear that because I have waited to ensure that the enemy situation vis-a-vis our own firmly supported plans I am being penalized and the resources which you so kindly offered and which we felt at last would present the opportunity to carry out our directive may be diverted elsewhere. The situation is progressing most satisfactorily on all fronts and conditions are being created that should ensure a complete liquidation of the enemy in upper Burma with the resulting increased air lift to China. I do hope that you appreciate my position and accept the suggestion that the allocation to other theatres of the remaining 200 combat cargo planes and the air commandos will not be made firm until our specific requirements for planned operations can be considered.

Summary internal India dated 30 June '44. 1-Gandhi is not expected to make any announcement of future policy for some time although he continues to draw out different opinions on the political situation. He is still far from normal although his health is improving. The rank and file of the Muslim and Hindu political parties are beginning to absorb the differences of opinion between the leaders and there is an increase in communal tension. Internal dissensions and outside interference are causing more or less difficult times for the ministries in all the autonomous provinces except Assam.

2-The war in the East has been overshadowed by the good news from the European Theatres of War as shown by the lack of enthusiasm following the important event of the opening of the Kohima-Imphal road. Great satisfaction was shown by the news of the landing in Normandy and the liberation of Cherbourg. Broadcasts of Japanese propaganda are increasingly discredited and ignored.

3-There is much optimism and enthusiasm that the end of the war has been brought appreciably nearer by the Allied landings in France.

Personal for Prime Minister and Chiefs of Staff repeated Joint Staff Mission from Mountbatten.

I have just come back from Imphal where I had talks with Generals Slim Scoones and Stopford. I drove down the road from Dimapur to Imphal which is in good condition. In fact the enemy in his hasty retreat did not even blow the bridges. The fighting at Kohima was exceptionally savage and the battlefield there looks like the Western Front during the last war.

4 Corps are now facing south of Imphal while 33rd Corps are responsible for operations to the northeast and north. There were indications a week ago that the Japanese intended to make a coordinated attack on Imphal from the northeast, southeast and southwest. This view was supported on enemy captured documents indicating that it was intended to stake everything on a last desperate offensive. No such offensive has however taken place. There have been spirited and well supported Japanese attacks on the Silchar track three and four miles west of Bishenpur. On two occasions ground has had to be given but our counterattacks restored the situation and many casualties were inflicted on the enemy.

Towards the end of the week, reports from 4 Corps area were of decreasing enemy activity, evacuated positions and only small parties of Japanese. Latest information is that there is no sign of enemy preparations for an offensive in this area.

In the Palel Tamu area there has been bitter fighting and determined counterattacks and some ground has been gained.

33 Corps have as their task to guard the Kohima Imphal Ls. of C. and to exploit success by pursuing and destroying the enemy. Their first objective in the latter task is Ukhru. The advance on Ukhru is going well and I have just heard that troops of the 7th Indian Division entered the village yesterday. Leading elements of a brigade of 20th Indian Division are about 20 miles southwest of Ukhru and the long range penetration brigade (23rd Brigade) is within three or four miles of the village to the north and about 20 miles to the east.

All reports agree that enemy troops are weak, short of supplies and disheartened. There are reports of continued withdrawals of the enemy south of Ukhru. Headquarters Japanese 31 Division is daily withdrawing south and is possibly moving to Humine 30 miles southeast of Ukhru where remnants of 31 Japanese Division may rally. There is still however considerable Japanese opposition on the Imphal Ukhru road itself probably from elements of 15 Division.

I also visited General Stilwell at Shadusup and found him in great heart. He tells me that they have killed over 2,000 Japanese in Myitkyina already and that he thinks the garrison is now reduced to about 800. He has agreed to release the remnants of (77?)th and 111th L.R.P. Brigades

With reference to SEACOS 189 about the use of gas by the Japanese confirmation of any large scale attack has been difficult to obtain. In a further message from Channault, the medical officer reports inspecting two casualties badly blistered from explosion of a gas shell. No further information obtainable at present on the quantity of gas used and number of casualties that occurred and doubt is expressed whether owing to the rapidly changing situation any further information will be obtained. In general original report appears to have been over emphasized.

As explained in SEACOS 180 it is quite clear that the operations necessary to accomplish the Combined Chiefs of Staff Directive will require the use in Southeast Asia of the Second Combat Cargo Group.

2. I have just concluded a tour of the front during which I have seen General Stilwell and General Stratemeyer and they have emphasized to me the urgent necessity of the arrival of this group at the earliest possible date. Request Combined Chiefs of Staff be asked make arrangements for despatch as soon as possible.

3. It is almost certain that as indicated in SEACOS 180 we shall require the third and probably also the fourth combat cargo group. In fact the accomplishment of our mission during the winter of 1944-5 depends on what transport aircraft can be provided. Intensive work is now in progress on planning for these operations and I intend to report on this in about a fortnight's time.

Section 1  
General

1. The main event of the fortnight has been the opening of the Kohima-Imphal Road, described in more detail in Section 3. This is the result of much hard fighting. In particular the fighting for Kohimadman immediate result has been to ease the supply situation in Imphal, where first convoy of 50 M.T. arrived on the evening of 22nd June. Exploitation of success eastwards by 20 (206?) Division and 7 Division against defeated and disorganized Japanese 15 and (231?) Division will continue to require supply by air.
2. Chinese-American capture of Mogaung is complete. Reduction of Myitkyina is still proceeding.
3. Naval air strike against Port Blair was carried out with success, but was disappointing in that no shipping present in harbour and only 2 enemy aircraft found on airfields.

(A) 2 Division have pressed on down the road Kohima-Imphal and in conjunction with 7 Division and 23 BDE have successfully opened the road. Viswema at MS 65, was cleared 14th June and contact made with troops of 5 Division at MS 109 22nd June. First convoy of 50 M.T. reached Imphal same evening. In final operations by 2 Division to clear the road many enemy were killed, and equipment captured included 13 guns. 11. Strategic Air Force. 40 short tons were dropped by Mitchells B-25's and Liberators B-24's on tactical targets in support of 4 corps and General Stilwell's forces. Heavy bombers only mounted 2 strategic operations both marred by weather. Of 24 U.S. aircraft detailed for Chauk oil installations, 2 reached Primery. 15 bombed Yenengyaung and 6 Lanywa with poor results. Of 12 R.A.F. aircraft on follow-up attack on Port Blair after naval operation 3 bombed in very bad weather. U. S. medium bombers damaged bridge at Bon Chaung.

12. 3rd Tactical Air Force. Beaufighters made series of successful attacks on River Steamer "Kaduma" which has probably been repaired by enemy to ease strain of L of C. On Manipur front at least 11 A.F.V.S. were destroyed or damaged by Hurricanes and Spitfires. Hurri-bombers flew 464 sorties in Ukhrul-Bishinpur-Kohima triangle meanwhile American fighters and fighter bombers concentrated on Mogaung-Myitkyina area. Spitfires claim 6 - 3 - 2 against Oscars over Palel on 16 June. Intruder operations over Burmese airfields hampered by weather.

13. Air Transport Operations. Transport aircraft will continue to supply Imphal until overland communications secure and reserve stocks built up. Therefore unlikely that rate of operations will drop appreciably in near future. Commitments to Stilwell, to Yunnan forces and to forces fighting to clear territory west of Chindwin also remain. U.S. heavy bomber group has been diverted to ferry petrol to China. The 1 U.S. transport squadron operating in support of Yunnan forces dropped 249 short tons. Total troop carrier effort in Burma theatre was 5894 sorties carrying 11,906 short tons and 5442 personnel. 3235 casualties evacuated in average daily lift into Imphal between 1st and 2nd June was 362 short tons.

14. Other activities. Overseas reconnaissance totalled 147 flights. Reported submarine in Maldives area searched for without positive result. Photographs reconnaissance of Andamans 24th June revealed slight damage to residential property on Ross Island and to building near Seaplane slipway. Sino G-2 also states that POW from 34th Division stated that he understood that objective of present drive was American base at Kweilin. Japanese radio has lately been stressing the importance of American base at Kweilin which also suggests drive in this direction contemplated. Japanese reported to be using airport at Hengyang. Chinese claim Yi Yang reoccupied on 29 June.

In Kwangtung 2 columns of 1000 each left Kongmoon and drop test on 25 June, but no further reports on their progress. On 29 June 3 columns headed north from Canton area headed towards Tsingyun (113 degrees 04 minutes east-23 degrees 43 minutes north), 1 column of 500 occupied small town Chouh Sin Chu east of Ching Yuan, a second column of 1000 occupied Hoi Lan Su southwest of Ching Yuan while a third column of 3000 occupied Tai Ping Su further to the west. Four regiments estimated to be in this area. Concentration of troops also reported at Tseng Chen (113 degrees 49 minutes east-23 degrees 16 minutes north). Tanks and armored cars reported crossing the Liu Shi River to north.

Much sea activity sighted on 28 June between Formosa and South China coast with 1 convoy of 12 ships reported headed for Hongkong and another convoy of 14 ships reported headed southwest from Formosa.

Honan area shows no further change. Chinese estimate only equivalent of 2 divisions left in this area. Units thought disposed as follows:
