OCTOBER 17, 1:45 P.M.

VOICES: Three cheers for Mr. Roosevelt. (applause)

MR. ROOSEVELT: I am very glad to see you people.

It is about eight years I think since I have been in Deposit. I used to come here a good deal in the old days, as you know, travelling through with my old friend, Clayton Wheeler, of Hancock. We just saw him a few minutes ago up the line.

I hope that after the first of January, I will be able to come back in an official capacity and see more of you in this part of the State.

I have only got about a minute to talk to you, and I would be very glad if you will let me introduce to you the other candidates on the Democratic ticket.

First of all, Colonel Lehman, Candidate for Lieut. Governor.

COLONEL LEHMAN: I am very glad to meet you, and I hope to come back too.

MR. ROOSEVELT: Also Mr. Morris Tremaine, the present Comptroller of the State of New York who has done so much in putting in a business-like administration up in Albany. (Applause) He isn't here, he is eating.

Also, the other candidate for Lieutenant Governor is hungry, apparently. So, just consider that they are introduced to you.

It is fine to see you, and I hope that you will do everything that you can this year to continue what I think is the finest government the State of New York has ever had -- under Governor Smith.

VOICES: (Three cheers for Franklin D. Roosevelt) Applause.

VOICE: We are going to put you over.
