"I have lived on a farm 50 years and have a farm in Georgia on which I raise cotton without profit. The prosperity of the farmer and the prosperity of the people who live in the cities are tied in together.

"I told the Chicago convention that I was not much of a partisan and that my quarrel was not with the millions of good men and women in the Republican party, but with the leadership of that party. On this trip I find that the Republicans in every state are putting aside partisanship in the hope of a New Deal."
