"My friends, I am glad of this opportunity to extend my deep appreciation to the electorate of this country which has given me thas great vote of confidence.

It is a vote that has more than more party significance; it transcends party lines. It became a national expression of liberal thought. It means, I am sure, that the masses of the people of this nation firmly believe that there is great and actual possibility in an orderly recovery through a well conceived and actively directed plan of action. Such a plan has been presented to you and you have expressed approval of it. This, my friends, is most reassuring to me. It shows that there is in the nation unbounded confidence in the future of sound agriculture and honorable industry.

This clear mandate shall not be forgotten. I pledge you this and
invite your help, the help of all of you in the happy task of restoration.
