I am awfully glad to see all of you here at North Platte. I haven't been out here for three long years and things certainly look a lot better than they did then. I am very glad to see the improved conditions.

I have been trying to stop a fight in the car about an old friend of mine, Buffelo Bill. (Laughter) I will always remember when I was about five years old, Buffelo Bill came to my little county town of Poughkeepsie on the Hudson River and I was a very proud youngster when I was allowed to shake him by the hand. We were talking about him in the car just now and the Senator from Wyoming said that Wyoming claimed him, but the Senator from Colorado said, "We claim him because he is buried in Colorado."

Buffalo Bill was a great, old man and very typical of the kind of spirit that I have been talking about today in Fremont. It is the kind of courage that has enabled you good people to go through a great many years of hard times with courage and faith and petience. I believe that you have come through and are on your way to better days. (Applause)
