EXTEMPORANEOUS REMARKS OF THE PRESIDENT
Easter Monday
April 14, 1941, 2:15 P.M.

(The President spoke to the crowds on the White House Lawn,
on an unusually beautiful day.)

(As the President came out on the South Portico, the crowds
began to cheer and applaud, which the President acknowledged by waving
his hand.)

I am very glad to welcome all of you here today on another of
these occasions, which through a great many years have made Easter Monday

It so happens that this year we have three things -- all coming
at the same time. We have Easter Monday and egg-rolling on the White House
lawn, and it coincides this year with the Blossom Festival which is known
