MEMORANDUM FOR

ANNA:

(1) Will you, or shall I, arrange to have Miss Suckley met at 5:30 Monday afternoon?

(2) You were going to remind the President to ask George Fox what they found wrong with Fala at Walter Reed.

(3) Mrs. Warren Robbins asked, a week or ten days ago, if, when the President returned from Ryde Park she could come in and dine with him. The President said "yes" but to speak to you. Perhaps the evening you are having the Wilson picture might be a good time for her to come in.

(4) I am making a note about the fishing rod for John and do you recall whether the other taped handle one was to go to Harry or who was it?

I think this covers all the little "remind-me" memos for both you and me.

Dear Grace:

When I talked to Father I completely forgot to tell him that an 8 to 10 rump roast of veal arrived here for him from Stanley Mortimer. When Stanley and his wife were here this fall they said they would send this from their farm where they raise calves. Will you find out if Father would like half of it sent down via pouch?

Eddie Roddan called me, after I talked to you, and said that Harry Slattery had found out today that a new set of charges against him has been sent over (presumably to Daniels), with the request that Father fire Slattery instead of accepting his resignation as now tendered.

Another side-light on this situation is that at lunch today with Harold Ickes, Harold said he had heard thru the grapevine that Slattery was trying to resign peacefully; that he, Harold, held no brief for Slattery because of his experience with him in Interior, but that he hoped Father would accept the resignation and give Slattery the usual short response of "regrets, and thanks for X years of public service", rather than to allow any new departmental row to get into the press.

That's all for now! Take care of that cold.
