They have stated to me that at a given moment -- not far off -- they will ask me in writing, as representative of the diplomatic corps in Paris, to act as guardian of the civil authority of this community during the transition from French Government to German military occupation, and to treat with the General commanding the German forces for the orderly occupation of the city.

I propose therefore at the appropriate moment to have broadcast a radio message stating that at a given time an automobile of the American Embassy in Paris properly

I have said nothing in this cable about the tradition that the American Ambassador does not leave Paris.
Remember Gouverneur Morris and his wooden leg in the

Following message telephoned by Ambassador

"Paris has been declared an open city. General Hering, military commander of Paris district, is withdrawing his army which has been defending Paris. All possible measures are being taken to assure the security of life and property in the city. The gendarmerie and police are remaining and the firemen also remaining to prevent fires. General Dentz is remaining as commander of the Paris area but without any troops simply with the gendarmerie and the police.

Ambassador Bullitt is remaining in Paris with the Military and Naval Attaches of the Embassy, the Counselor of Embassy and six Secretaries of Embassy - 2 - 465, Time 13, 2 p.m. from Bern

as the representative of the diplomatic corps. Mr. Bullitt hopes to be of any assistance possible in seeing to it that the transfer of the Government of the city takes place without loss of human life. This entire communication is made at the personal request of General Pentz."

I have telephoned the foregoing to Embassy at Berlin.

In addition to transmitting this message to the American Embassy at Berlin Mr. Bullitt requested that it be repeated to the Department with an explanation that this action replaces the action indicated that he might take in a long telegram to the President yesterday.

Mr. Bullitt said that there was no more radio or telephone communication with the United States.

He also particularly requested that the Department should be informed that after the occupation of the city there will be enough food in the city to keep the population now estimated by him at two million people alive for two weeks and that after that there will be nothing whatsoever to eat unless something is done about it.

FROM BULLITT, CAIRO, SENET TO THE PRESIDENT. WHEN I FIRST REACHED CAIRO, I SUGGESTED TO LYTTLETON THAT IT SHOULD NOT BE IMPOSSIBLE TO GET THE FRENCH FLEET IN ALEXANDRIA (1 BATTLE-SHIP, 3 HEAVY CRUISERS, 1 LIGHT CRUISER, 4 DD'S, AND 1 SUB) TO COME OVER TO OUR SIDE. HE SAID THAT THE DIFFICULTY WAS THAT THERE WAS MUCH TOO MUCH HOSTILITY ON THE PART OF THE FRENCH OFFICERS & MEN BOTH TO THE BRITISH AND TO THE FREE FRENCH TO BE WILLING TO JOIN EITHER OF THOSE FORCES. 

I HOPE THAT YOU AND CHURCHILL IN YOUR PLANNING ARE KEEPING IN MIND THE VITAL NEED TO RETAIN EGYPT AS A SECURE BASE NOT ONLY FOR

OPERATIONS IN LIBYA TUNISIA PALESTINE THE LEBANON SYRIA AND TURKEY BUT ALSO FOR TRANSIT OF PLANES TO INDIA AND THE FAR EAST.

AS I HAVE NOTED IN PREVIOUS MESSAGES THE DISTANCES IN THIS AREA ARE SO IMMENSE AND THE FORCES ENGAGED RELATIVELY SO SMALL THAT A





QUOTE(ONE)LYTTLETON HAS ASKED ME TO JOIN HIM IN A STATEMENT OF OUR VIEWS WHICH ARE IN AGREEMENT ON THE POSSIBILITY OF AN INVASION OF TUNISIA IN CASE AUCHINLECKS FORCES SHOULD REACH THE TUNISIAN FRONTIER.
