Exports to Russia, Free China, Burma and other blocked countries, as reported to the Treasury Department during the ten-day period ending June 20, 1942

1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending June 20, 1942 amounted to about \$54,000,000 as compared with \$18,000,000 during the corresponding period in May and about \$67,000,000 during the corresponding period in April. Among the military equipment exported during the period under review were 58 one engine pursuit, interceptor and fighter planes; 24 bombers, and 232 tanks. (See Appendix C.)

2. Exports to Free China and Burma

Exports to Free China as reported during the ten-day period ending June 20, 1942 amounted to \$2,707,000, of which military equipment accounted for more than ninety-five percent. (See Appendix D.)

No exports to Burma were reported during the period under review.

3. Exports to France

No exports to France were reported during the period under review.

4. Exports to other blocked countries

Exports to other blocked countries, which are given in Appendix A, were negligible during the ten-day period ending June 20, 1942.

Exports to Russia, Free China, Burma and other blocked countries, as reported to the Treasury Department during the ten-day period ending June 30, 1942

1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending June 30, 1942 amounted to about \$50,000,000 as compared with about \$54,000,000 during the previous ten-day period. Among the military equipment exported during the period under review were 69 one engine pursuit and fighter planes, 11 two engine light bombers, 56 two engine medium bombers and 117 tanks. (See Appendix C.)

2. Exports to Free China and Burma

Exports to Free China as reported during the ten-day period under review amounted to \$1,664,000 as compared with \$2,707,000 during the previous ten-day period. Military equipment accounted for about \$1,106,000 of the total exported. (See Appendix D.)

Exports to Burma as reported during the period under review amounted to about \$60. (See Appendix E.)

3. Exports to France

No exports to France were reported during the period under review.

4. Exports to other blocked countries

Exports to other blocked countries are given in Appendix A. Exports to Switzerland and Portugal were most important, amounting to \$591,000 and \$165,000, respectively.



Exports to Russia, Free China, Burma, France and other blocked countries, as reported to the Treasury Department during the ten-day period ending July 10, 1942.

1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending July 10, 1942 amounted to about \$36,000,000 as compared with approximately \$50,000,000 during the previous ten-day period. Among the military equipment exported during the period under review were 60 P-40 pursuit fighters, 39 light bombers, 4 medium bombers and 77 tanks. (See Appendix C.)

2. Exports to Free China and Burma

Exports to Free China as reported during the ten-day period under review amounted to \$7,900,000. Military equipment accounted for nearly 85% of the total. (See Appendix D.)

Exports to Burma as reported during the period under review amounted to about \$45,000. (See Appendix E.)

3. Exports to France

Exports to France during the period under review amounted to less than \$500.

4. Exports to other blocked countries

Exports to other blocked countries are given in Appendix A. Exports to Portugal were most important, amounting to \$162,000.



1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia, as reported during the ten-day period ending August 20, 1942, amounted to \$23,325,000, as compared with \$33,940,000 and \$53,799,000 during the same periods in July and June, 1942, respectively. Among the military equipment exported during the period under review were 18 light bombers, 36 fighter planes and 27 tanks. (See Appendix C.)

2. Exports to Free China

Exports to Free China, as reported during the period under review, amounted to \$192,000, as compared with \$590,000 and \$2,707,000 during July and June, 1942, respectively. Military equipment accounted for about 79% of the total. (See Appendix D.)

3. Exports to selected blocked countries

Exports to selected blocked countries are given in Appendix A. Most important were exports to Sweden and Switzerland amounting to \$324,000 and \$167,000, respectively.

1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending October 20, 1942 amount to \$55,083,000 as compared with \$14,564,000 during the previous ten-day period. Among the military equipment exported were 74 tanks, 25 light bombers and 68 fighter planes. (See Appendix C).

2. Exports to Free China

Exports to Free China as reported during the period under review amounted to only \$30,000 of which all was military equipment.

3. Exports to selected blocked countries

Exports to selected blocked countries are given in Appendix A. Most important were exports to Switzerland and Sweden amounting to \$281,000 and \$117,000, respectively.



1. Exports to Russia

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending November 20, 1942 amounted to \$45,867,000 as compared with \$53,144,000 during the previous ten-day period. Military equipment accounted for \$24,452,000 of the total and included 48 light bombers, 87 fighter planes and 20 tanks. (See Appendix C.)

2. Exports to Free China

Exports to Free China as reported during the period under review amounted to \$2,032,000, of which military equipment accounted for \$773,000. (See Appendix D.)

3. Exports to selected blocked countries

Exports to selected blocked countries are given in Appendix A. Most important were exports to Switzerland and Portugal amounting to \$443,000 and \$396,000 respectively.

Exports to Russia as reported during the ten-day period ending November 30, 1942 amounted to \$88,415,000 making a total of \$187,426,000 for the month of November. Military equipment accounted for \$55,376,000 of the total for the period under review and included 247 tanks, 100 105-mm. self-propelled howitzers and 27 light bombers. (See Appendix C.)
