My dear Mrs. Roosevelt :-

This is the suggestion for a conference for farm relief which I talked to you about on the train the other morning. I talked about it briefly to Mr. Roosevelt, but the newspaper men arrived before we could go into it in detail. He asked me to send to him via you the memorandum which I had prepared. Therefore, I am burdening you with it. Thank you so much.

It was awfully nice to see you on Saturday and I enjoyed tremendously my glimpse of your lovely place. I thank you so much for asking me out. I had a very satisfactory talk with Mr. Roosevelt and under conditions which couldn't possibly have occurred otherwise. You will be very busy this next week or ten days, I know, but let me do anything I can to help you at any time.

I can't tell you how much the women of this State admire your prospective relationship to government; a new kind of a contribution is what you are going to make, I think.
