I have gone through the War lefugee Board's records in an attempt to give you some additional material on the Board's activities for your speech in New York. As we indicated last week, there is very little more that can now be told.

The food parcel program, mentioned in Mr. Pehle's speech of ctober 15, will be expanded. But in the interests of continuing the program more than that cannot be said.

Evacuations from Bulgaria through Turkey to Falestine continue. Will representative Katzki is on the job in Turkey carrying on the work begun by Mr. Hirschmann.

lescue and relief operations are being conducted in Norway from bweden, and other rescue and relief operations are being conducted in behalf of Jews remaining in the Baltic States.

The Foard has developed special procedures to benefit persons in energy territory for whom U. b. immigration visas were issued or authorized after July 1, 1941, or who are eligible as close relatives of American citizens or resident aliens for non-quota or preference quota visas. A program for protection of Jews beloing latin-American passports is being carried out.

The program of psychological warfare continues with the nelp of OWI. Socretary Hull's statement of October 10 and Covernor Dewey's statement on Mazi atrocities were widely publicized overseas. Also widely publicized overseas was Gereral Disonhower's warning of November 7, urging Germans not to obey orders to molest, harm or persecute men in concentration comps or forced labor battalions. The German atrocity stories dealing with conditions in Auschwitz and Birkenau have been widely disseminated.

The Board is working through diplomatic channels to get bephardic Jews with Spanish passports out of Bergen-Belsen.

The facilitation of rescue programs of various private agencies continues.

Will representative Roswell McClelland, is working desperately in Switzerland to save the remaining Jews in Europe. Most of the Goard's efforts are being concentrated in Switzerland now, since that is the one place a job can be done.
