

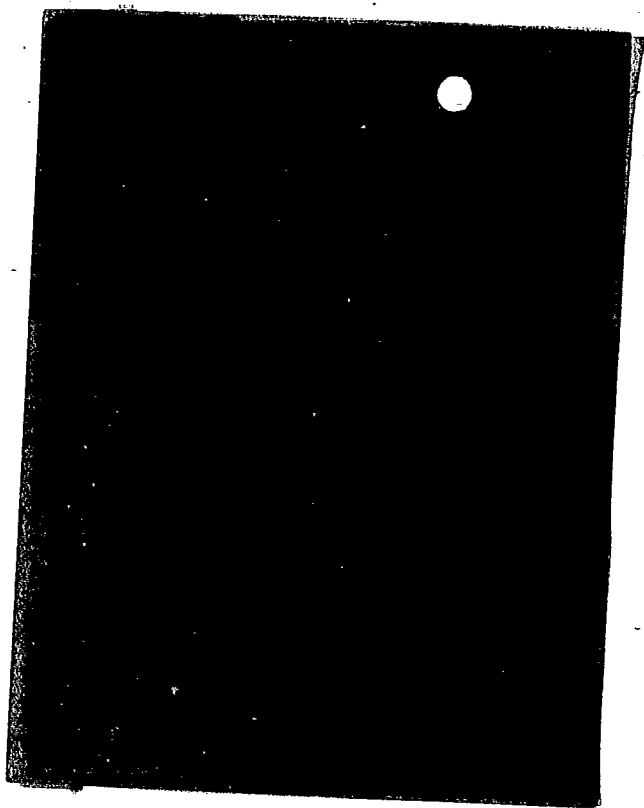

Reference is made to your letter of October 23, 1944, stating that your attention has been called by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society to communications of this Service addressed to that organization under Visa numbers 3011584 and 3068625 relating to Mordka Joseph Smutek and Erwin Gluck, respectively. These letters state that inasmuch as the territories in which the beneficiaries reside have been liberated their cases are not regarded as being within the class presently receiving attention by the War Refugee Board and that it would be necessary to defer filing applications for verification of last entry until such time as the addresses of the American consuls to whom the beneficiaries will apply for visas have been definitely ascertained.

In your letter under reference you advised this Service that the War Refugee Board is in possession of information indicating that large numbers of persons whose last known addresses were in France were removed eastward by the Germans prior to the liberation of France and that for this reason the Board is not prepared automatically to exclude from the program any persons solely because they were known to have been in France prior to its liberation, although the Board's programs are not applicable to such persons if they are now in liberated areas.

In view of the foregoing this Service will consider the cases of persons whose last known addresses were in France as within the program. Accordingly, appropriate advice in the premises is being furnished the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society. *a*

The Board's attention has been called by the Hebrew Sheltering and Immigrant Aid Society to your letters addressed to them, Visa 5011504 V/AU and Visa 5000625 V/AU.

With reference to the ultimate sentences of each of your said letters, please be advised that the Board is in possession of information indicating that large numbers of persons whose last known addresses were in France were removed eastward by the Germans prior to the liberation of France. For this reason, the Board is not prepared automatically to exclude from the program any persons solely because they were known to have been in France prior to its liberation. In this connection, the Board has been careful to advise its representatives abroad, in submitting the names of persons last known to have been in France and other liberated areas, that the Board's programs are not applicable to them if they are now in liberated areas.

I would appreciate it very much, therefore, if you would reconsider the position taken by you in the letters under reference.
