My dear General O'Dwyer:

The records of this office show that on March 29, 1939 a petition for issuance of immigration visa, submitted by Rachela Liptscher Fuhrer in behalf of Lena Liptscher, was approved and forwarded to the Department of State on September 8, 1939 for transmission to the American Consulate nearest the place of residence of the beneficiary, who was then residing at Romanowskiego 16, Nowysacz, Poland. Mrs. Lena Liptscher was born in Kroskienoko, Poland on March 10, 1877.

It does not appear that Mrs. Liptscher has been admitted to the United States for permanent residence subsequent to the approval given on March 29, 1939, therefore the authorization appears to be outstanding, and the filing of a new petition is regarded as unnecessary.
