A copy of that letter has also been furnished the Department of State, Washington, D. C.

If Captain Rewicz has not been in the United States subsequent to the approval given in his favor on May 3, 1941, the authorization appears to be outstanding and it will not be necessary to file a new petition. Under the approved petition he was accorded a first preference quota status. Such aliens are required to file Forms BC with the Department of State before a visa may be issued to them. If you desire further information regarding this phase of the case, it can only be suggested that you write to the Visa Division, Department of State, Washington, D. C.
