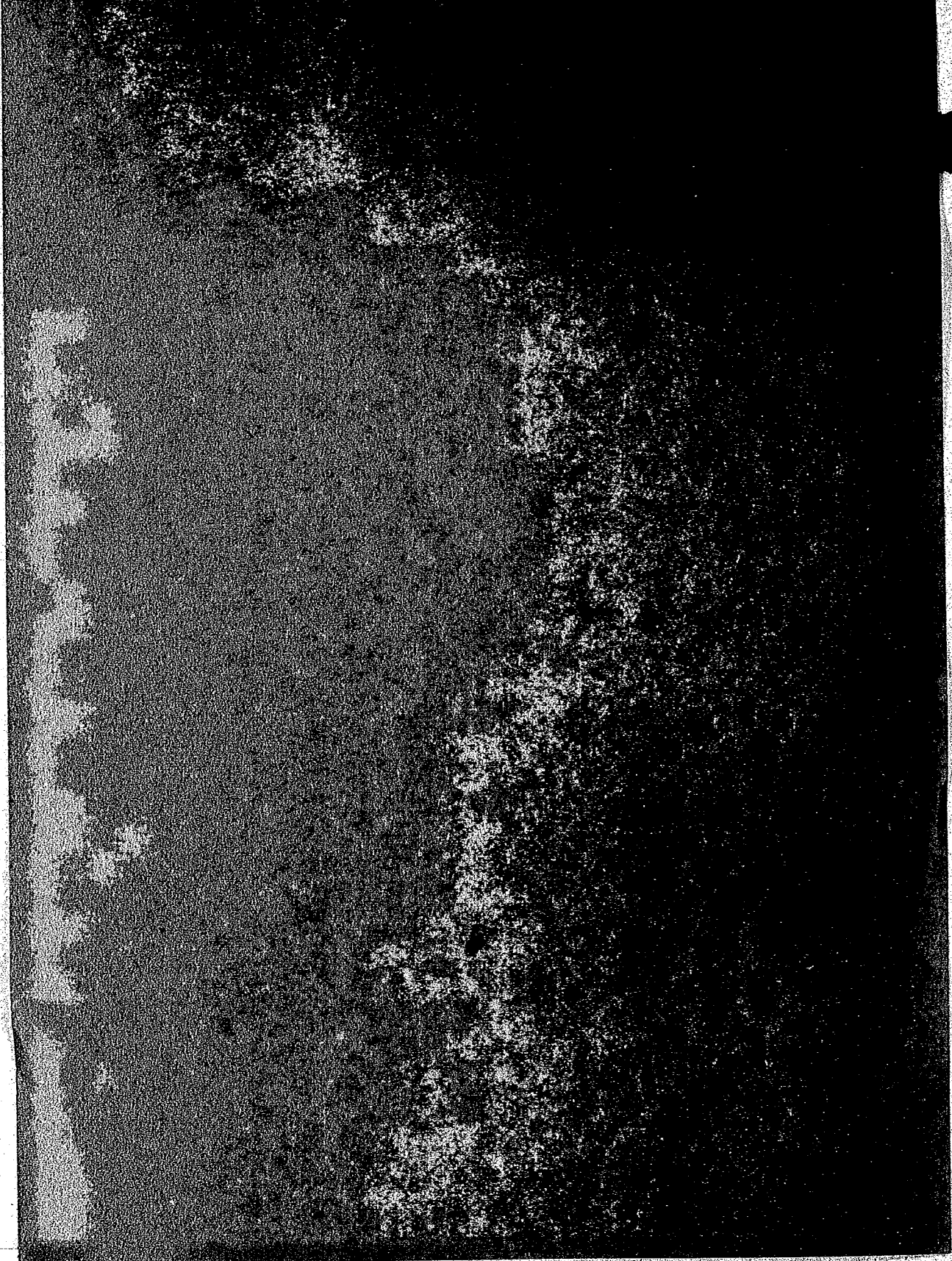

The records of this office show that on July 6, 1940, a petition for issuance of immigration visa submitted by Mrs. Sidy Weikersheimer Rosenfeld, in behalf of Moritz Weikersheimer, was approved and forwarded to the Department of State on July 30, 1940, for transmission to the American consul nearest the place of residence of her father. Mr. Weikersheimer was born in Muenchen, Germany on September 20, 1881. As Mr. Weikersheimer has not been in the United States subsequent to the approval given on July 6, 1940, it appears the authorization is still outstanding.

Mrs. Esther B.
