Please, may I be permitted to submit to you a photostatic copy of a postcard received recently telling me of the fate of my parents, father born 1862 and mother 1866.

This might show you how the Cermans mistreat helpless Jewish people, and there ought to be a retaliation for such cruelty. In my opinion, Germans and Mazis are all alike and do not deserve mercy!
