Dear Mr. Pehle:

In reply to your recent inquiry relative to our activities in behalf of Refugees, we wish to state that our organization undertook the "Danish Refugee Fund Drive" and we have collected in contributions a little better than \$50,000.00. To date we have transmitted to Sweden for the purpose of assisting needy Danish Refugees \$50,000.00. Funds are still being received for this drive, but it is the writer's opinion that further collections will hardly exceed another \$50,000.00. No other specific plans are in the making within our group to help these Refugees.

We are, of course, organized to lend assistance also to the needy within Denmark when time comes and we have units operating in the United States (about sixty of them) whose task is to collect, repair and make garments for ultimate shipment to Denmark.

Whether this phase of our activity is of value or interest to your particular program we do not know.

However, if we can give you further information, we shall, of course, be happy to cooperate.
