Dear Mr. Beer:

I have your letter of July 2, 1944, requesting the assistance of the War Refugee Board in securing information about your family in Italy.

Your concern for the safety of your family meets with the fullest sympathy of the Board. I am sure you will understand, however, that the task of the Board is so great that, of necessity, it cannot deal with problems limited to seeking out specific individuals. We are, of course, doing everything in our power to rescue and save the victims of enemy persecution who are in imminent danger of death.

I am enclosing a list of private organizations which I am advised may be in a position to be of some help to you in this matter, and suggest that you refer your problem to any one of them.
