In June this year I have talked to you about my relatives and parents in Carpatho-Ruthenia, formerly part of Czechoslovakia. - I was told at that time that nothing could be done in the way of getting them to a safe place. - Since then I understand that the British and our Gomb's have come to some sort of understanding with the Hungarian Nazi Gov't for the release of Jews to neutral territory. - How does that affect my people? - How can I help them with money or any other way? - Is there any way of finding out their whereabouts?





Dear Major Eisner:

I have your letter of April 10, 1944, requesting the assistance of the War Refugee Board in aiding your family to escape from Hungary.

Your appeal for assistance in rescuing your family from the Nazis meets with the fullest sympathy of the Board. I am sure you will understand, however, that the task of the Board is so great that, of necessity, it cannot deal with problems limited to seeking out and rescuing specific individuals. We shall, of course, do everything in our power to rescue and save the victims of enemy oppression who are in imminent danger of death.

I suggest that you may wish to refer your problem to a private organization. There is enclosed a list of some of the organizations which I am advised may be in a position to be of some help to you.
