Dear Mr. Falco:

I have your letter of March 15, 1945, concerning your desire to arrange for the immigration of your orphaned nephews and nieces to this country from Italy.

I am sorry that the War Refugee Board is not in a position to be of assistance to you in this problem since matters of immigration are not within its jurisdiction. While I am not informed as to the facilities which may be available for this purpose at the present time, it is possible that a private organization may be able to help you to make the necessary arrangements or to give you information as to the procedure to be followed. I suggest that you seek the assistance of any one of the agencies named in the enclosed list.
