Dear Mrs. Friedman:

Your attention is called to my letter of April 18, 1944, in response to your letters of March 27 and April 4, 1944 in which you requested the assistance of the War Refugee Board in aiding your family to escape from Hungary.

From your letters it appears that the issuance of a visa for the members of your family to enter the United States may have been authorized after July 1, 1941. If such a visa was authorized, I would appreciate your furnishing us with the following additional information:

1. The date of authorization of the issuance of such visa by the Department of State;
2. The exact names and last known addresses of the members of your family for whom such visa was authorized;
3. The reference or file number assigned to the visa or to its correspondence with you by the Department of State.

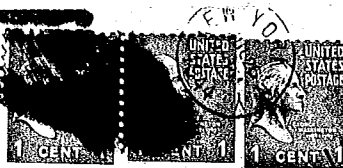
