Dear Mr. Frisch:

I have your letter of December 8, 1944, concerning your desire to help your niece who is presently in Craiova, Roumania.

The Board was established by the President solely for the purpose of rescuing and bringing relief to victime of enemy persecution in imminent danger of death. As your niece is in Roumania, which is under Allied occupation, her life is no longer in danger and the Board is unable to be of any assistance to her.

It is possible, however, that a private organization may be in a position to assist you in this matter, and I suggest that you refer your problem to any one of the agencies named in the enclosed list.
