Leibovitch wrote that the State Department had cabled Sofia in 1941 authorizing the issuance of visas for Fis family but that due to war conditions they were unable to emigrate. If you are able to verify this we might attempt the experiment mentioned in paragraph 4 of Department's telegram 665 WRB's 85. Should this not be feasible at this time you might wish to advise one of the private agencies regarding this case.

With the establishment of American political th sions in Bucharest and Sofia you might wish to impure whether it is in order to transmit to the reoperture missions lists of persons in Rumania, Bulgaria and Bungary for when advisory approvals had been outherized by the Tise Division but whose Emigration was halted because of war conditions. Experimetion is that such lists were being prepared by the board or the Sinterested private organizations. If this is not feasible the lists might be transmitted to the American Conculate General in Istanial or turn over to the private agencies.
