Dear Mr. Muensterberger:

I have your letter of August 15, 1944, requesting visas for your daughter and her family in order that they may come to the United States from Switzerland.

As you desire to have your daughter and her family come to this country for permanent legal residence, I suggest that you communicate with the Department of Justice, Immigration and Naturalization Service, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, for information as to the procedure necessary to obtain these visas when it is possible to emigrate from Switzerland.

In the meantime, it is possible that a private organization may be able to be of some assistance to you, and I suggest that you communicate with any one of the agencies named in the enclosed list.

J consider your time very short, therefore the shortness of my letter. We are german jews and we were going away after several antisemitic troubles already 1933 in the beginning of Hitler. We lived in Paris 5, in Vichy 1 year and perhaps 9 moths in Marseille and are now 3 years in America.....

My children, my son in law, my daughter and 2 children 9 and 6 remained in St Laurent de Ceris - Charente - near Angoulême with the intention to follow us after the sale of cattle and other goods. In this time the Charente was not occupied, 5 months later the bandit took the whole France and they must flee by night and fog, only to save the life..... they now as refugees in Bern Switzerland. They are a strong people with 10 years experience in all the branches of agriculture as wine-growing, cattle breeding and cultivation of corn etc.

For me is now on problem: To help ~~my help~~ my children to come to America, the land of liberty, and in this way J met Mr Harry C Rogers, farmer in Dove Creek Colorado, a gentleman and philanthropist in the best sense of this word. He will take care of this farmer-family giving all the necessary as are sustaining quarters and accomodations ~~giving~~ without any charge of USA government.

My problem is solved with receipt of the visas for my son in law with wife and children, and now J request you if you can help
