Dear Mrs. Ollendorff:

I have your letter of May 12, 1945, requesting assistance in locating your mother, who was last known to be in Germany, and on whose behalf a petition for an immigration visa has been approved.

I am sorry that the War Refugee Board is unable to handle inquiries of this nature concerning specific individuals. In view of the very limited facilities available for communicating with certain areas in Europe, I suggest that you ask your local Red Cross chapter to help you to send a message through the International Red Cross seeking to ascertain your mother's present whereabouts.
