Dear Mrs. Reichmann:

I have your letter of June 7, 1945, concerning your desire to locate a number of your relatives who formerly resided in Hungary and Czechoslovakia and who are believed to have been deported by the Germans.

I fully understand your anxiety to learn the present whereabouts and welfare of these relatives, and I regret very much that the War Refugee Board is not in a position to undertake inquiries of this nature concerning specific individuals. While it is my understanding that the facilities which are at the present time available for communicating with certain newly liberated areas are extremely limited, I am taking the liberty of sending copies of your letter and its enclosure to the Vaad Hahatzala Emergency Committee of the Union of Orthodox Rabbis with the request that they furnish you with whatever information they may be able to obtain concerning the persons named.

I undersigned Renee Reichmann request respectfully herewith the War Refugee Board to be so kind to find out the residence of my nine brothers and sisters, their wives, husbands and children as well as the mother, brothers and sisters of my husband who all have been deported from their residence by the Germans.

Our desperation is so great especially at present when we and the whole world know about the infinitely dreadful destiny passed by millions of deported people that it is impossible to describe it.

When I take leave to disturb you with this request, you who take care for the assistance of these millions of unfortunate people, then it is so because I had personally the honour to get acquainted with the infinitely immense volume of your work and the care for the destiny of each one by one of your delegates when I talked last July at the office of the American Relief Organisation in Madrid.

All my relations possess a permit of entrance to Tangier and I should like make use of it as soon as possible and get them some aid meanwhile.
