Two clients of mine, Mr. Joseph Wirth and Mr. Paul Farkas, both of Wirth Products, Inc., 1265 Broadway, New York City, having read the statement of the Department of State re the Jews in Hungary, issued on August 17 and published in the New York Times of August 18, want me to get Swiss visas for their close relatives still living in Hungary in order to enable them to be among those who will be permitted to come to this country, in accordance with above mentioned statement.

In view of certain wartime and censorship restrictions I should be very thankful to you if you would inform me about the procedure of these cases.

Considering the emergency I should appreciate your immediate reply.
