Your letter of November 10, 1944, addressed to Mr. Hirschmann, has been forwarded by him to this office.

The War Refuges Board was created solely for the purpose of rescuing and bringing relief to victims of enemy persecution in imminent danger of death. Ever since its inception, the Board has taken all action within its power to rescue and bring relief to such persons by all means consistent with the successful prosecution of the war.

At present, Bucharest is under Allied occupation, and the lives of persons residing there are no longer in danger from the enemy. All questions regarding the immigration of such persons to the United States should be referred to the Visa Division of the Department of State.
