ciate that the task of the War Refugee Board is so
great that, of necessity, it cannot deal with prob-
lems limited to seeking out specific individuals.

one of several private organizations which I am ad-

Gentlemen:

May I ask you to kindly give me the following information:

A friend of mine (a journalist from Vienna, Austria) has been in a concentration camp in south Italy for four years and has been freed when the Allies took the town (Campagna in the province of Salerno) last fall. He has all that is required to enter the United States as an immigrant for permanent residence. (Quota and affidavit) but was unable to come over four years ago ~~when~~ because of Italy's entry into the war.

What I would like to know is if these newest regulations which will allow refugees from Europe to find temporary haven in this country refer to such a case too, or what steps could be taken to enable this person to enter on an immigrant visa.
